



Waiting is not something that any of us are accustomed to anymore. We live in a world of fast food, express lanes, and instant access to entertainment and information at our fingertips. Have a question? No need to wait--Just ask Siri or Alexa!

Multi-tasking seems to be a necessity. Some of you now may be reading this bulletin on a mobile device while doing something else. We feel the need to not have any down time. While standing in line at the grocery we may be tracking a last minute Christmas gift package, and replying to a text or an email on our phones.

The message of the Advent Season is about waiting and focusing on one thing—preparing our hearts for Jesus. Of course the month of December is a flurry of activity in an elementary school, but we have worked very hard to help our students slow down during the Advent Season and focus on preparing our hearts for Jesus. All students have been engaged in age appropriate Advent prayers and art. As a school we participated in collecting toys for children in Appalachia, and several classes adopted angels from the Giving Tree.

Each year the JPII third graders retell the story of the First Christmas at the grade 3-5 Christmas program. What a privilege for our students to be able to share their faith with all of our families at this special event. It is always a touching moment when the angel Gabriel announces the birth of Jesus.

JPII's version of an Elf on a Shelf is Noel, our Advent Elf. Noel surprises us each morning by appearing throughout the school as a reminder to be especially kind to one another and to keep the focus of the season on the birth of the Christ Child. She has been spotted reading a book about the First Christmas, sitting in a classroom Advent wreath, and holding baby Jesus. We enjoy those daily reminders of the Advent message Noel provides. I have even had a grandparent ask me "Where is Noel today?"

Of course, our daily Religion lessons and homilies at Mass all assist in keeping the Advent focus. Father Tom explained the Advent message so well at the Mass attended by the school students by telling the children that Advent is a time of "Already", and "Not Yet". The teachers have done an excellent job of continuing this conversation in the classroom even with our youngest students.

The season of Advent is one of the many times of the school year that the faculty and staff at JPII are so pleased to be able

to partner with parents to reinforce the important messages and values that are taught at home. We are truly blessed to have the opportunity to continue the important mission of our Catholic school thanks to the support of all of the JPII Parishioners.



- 4. Take them with you for Christmas gatherings and invite people to look at them (sometimes just seeing them is enough).
- 5. Give them as Christmas gifts or New Year's Gifts, or Valentine's Day or Easter, or the 2nd Wednesday of Each Month gift.
- 6. Email the flier to everyone on your email contact list. Flier can be downloaded from parish website.
- 7. Emphasize the stained glass windows and how these windows will help us create a beautiful worship space at JPII.



THE "O" ANTIPHONS-An Ancient Tradition

The O Antiphons refer to the seven antiphons that are prayed immediately before the Magnificat during Vespers of the Liturgy of the Hours. Each antiphon begins with the exclamation "O", thus earning their popular name the "O Antiphons." They cover the special period of Advent preparation known as the Octave before Christmas, from Dec. 17-23, with Dec. 24 being Vespers of the Christmas Vigil.

Sacraments & Sacramental Preparation

Baptisms: Typically celebrated at weekend Masses. A Baptism Preparation Session is required for parents. The next session will be the first of the year. Watch the bulletin for dates.

Confessions: Available Friday mornings at 11:15am at the St. Joe Hill Chapel and Saturdays at 4:15pm at the St. Paul Chapel. You may also contact Fr. Tom at 812-246-2512 to schedule an appointment.

Marriage: Please contact Fr. Tom at 812-246-2512 at least six months prior to planned wedding date. The marriage preparation process will be explained at that time.

Anointing of the Sick: If you are aware of an upcoming medical event for which you would like this sacrament, you may contact Fr. Tom to schedule the sacrament at 812-246-2512. In case of an emergency, contact Fr. Tom at 502-553-3770.

Confirmation: Preparation can begin upon completion of eighth grade or anytime throughout high school; more information is available on the parish website or contact Dawn Schepers. For adults interested in Confirmation, contact Kristina Seipel.
