Alpha is an 11-week series that invites people to explore life, its meaning and purpose, and how a relationship with Jesus Christ can solidify the path we are all navigating. We offer the Adult Alpha program in the fall and early spring of each year; in addition, we offer Alpha Youth yearly in the spring. We are expanding our Alpha Series to include college age, married couples, and nursing homes. Each Alpha session includes a meal/ hospitality, a video from the film series, then table discussions.

Open To: Alpha is open to all parishioners, families, friends, and anyone seeking meaning and purpose in their lives.

Volunteer: Opportunities include serving on teams, assisting with meal prep, set up/tear down, art & environment, and inviting others to come to an upcoming Alpha. All training is provided.

Time Commitment: Approximately 3 hours each week for 11 weeks with some time for outside work.

SACRAMENTS - COME AND SEE

JPII is committed to nurturing the Sacramental life of our community. We offer quarterly Come and Sees for any and all parishioners interested in learning more about the processes for Baptism, First Reconciliation, First Communion, and Confirmation.

BAPTISM

Our process for Baptism Preparation begins with a pastoral meeting with our Director of Evangelization and then meeting with parent(s) who are active, faith-filled parishioners, and have completed the preparation process and celebration of the Sacrament of Baptism for their child/children, Volunteer parent(s) are needed to serve on the team and rotate with other team members in meeting with new parishioners seeking baptism for their infant/child.

FIRST RECONCILIATION

Children are invited to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation once they have reached the age of reason and feel ready to celebrate this Sacrament. The process includes catechesis, making an initial contact with the Director of Evangelization, and participating in a morning of reflection.

FIRST EUCHARIST

Children are invited to celebrate their First Eucharist once they have reached the age of reason (age seven), celebrated First Reconciliation, and feel ready to celebrate this next Sacrament of Initiation. The process includes catechesis, making an initial contact with the Director of Evangelization, and participating in a morning of reflection.

CONFIRMATION

Youth typically celebrate the sacrament of Confirmation in high school. Our process includes participating in an Alpha Youth series, active participation in JPII's youth ministry, regular Mass attendance, service, and journeying with a faith companion to create a spiritual growth plan. Volunteer: Small Group leader, youth ministry volunteer, service ministry leader, and faith companion.

Time Commitment: Varies depending on which process component you choose.

OCIA / OCIC

OCIA - the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults is a process of exploration of the Catholic Faith, tradition and discipleship. Journeying with Faith Companions, participating in an Alpha series, and learning the basic tenets of Catholicism are part of this adventure. The first step is to contact our Director of Evangelization and set into motion the journey God has prepared for you! We also offer OCIC - the Order of Christian Initiation of Children. Open to: Anyone seeking to become fully initiated in the Catholic Faith Tradition. Volunteer: Opportunities include serving as a faith companion, serving in an Alpha Series, teaching and catechizing basic tenets, serving as a Breaking Open the Word facilitator.

Time Commitment: Varies upon which aspect of the process you volunteer.


