THOUGHTS FROM FR. RICHARD
PENSAMIENTOS DE PADRE RICARDO

I ATTENDED MY FIRST RETIREMENT WORKSHOP

Last week, I attended my first retirement workshop put on for diocesan priests. There were about 10 inquirers. Some were in their mid-sixties, beginning to think about retiring, others with new health conditions that may require retiring early, a number nearing 70 and very interested in retiring, and believe it or not, a priest at 82, still a pastor, who wants to build a permanent church before he retires. He hopes to retire when he's 85 or 86. I am the only priest definitely retiring next year who is not waiting until he is 85 or 86.

The first presenter talked about the psychological issues and aids to navigate such a transition positively. Planning in an intentional way is the first step toward success. Retiring from priesthood is very different from retiring from another kind of profession, because a priest remains a priest and will always practice in some way. A lot to think about, but all good common sense. There was some good testimony from retired priests themselves — the actual experiences of going through it.

The diocese has a Health Care Manager for Retired Priests, a nurse, who begins the process toward retirement by making sure all the paperwork, health documents, wills, testaments and funeral arrangements are all in order and on file. The manager will see to the arranging of new living situations when needed, and any kind of care that will be needed along the way. Even Catholic Cemeteries was there to offer their services and discounts for clergy. And then, of course, there was a presentation on benefits as well. The retirement salary is \$66.00 times the years of service. Health coverage continues as well.

It was a very interesting day of thoughtful conversation, information and questions. So I have a number of things to follow up on.

■ NEW YOUTH MINISTER HIRED

The news of the week is that we have completed our search for a new Youth Ministry Coordinator. He is Jacob Perry, whose family lives in Antioch and who is a recent graduate of Franciscan University in Steubenville, Illinois. Jacob has a very engaging personality. While he looks like a teenager, he comes well-trained and educated in theology, philosophy and catechetics. He is a bundle of enthusiasm, loves the Lord very much and wants to share whom He knows and what he knows with teenagers.

Jacob succeeds Miranda Ripoli, who leaves after four years to enter the field of Catholic High School education. She will be teaching in the theology department of St. Patrick- St. Vincent High School in Vallejo.

■ FR GEORGE RETURNS

Fr. TC George returned to Bangalore, India last week after spending a month with us here at St. Bonaventure's. I wish to thank you for your generous support of our Center for Street Children And Teenagers there in Bangalore, with all its related services. At the moment, Fr. George has raised over \$25,000 to help pay the expenses of the children's education.

■ BIG BIBLE CAMP THANK YOU

We have just finished a big Barnyard Roundup where 340 children, 164 junior and senior high school counsellors and 80 adults celebrated and learned about Jesus as the Good Shepherd. New friends were made. Lots of fun experiences were had. Tears were shared when once it was all over because they could not be together forever. And we have to thank Farmer Rosann Halick, Miranda Ripoli, and Debbie Schnick as chief organizers of the whole experience. The yearly Bible Camp has become what it has become because of Rosann.

■ DEACON GUSTAVO TRANSFERRED TO PITTSBURG

Bishop Michael Barber has transferred Deacon Gustavo Escruceria to the Church of the Good Shepherd in Pittsburgh. For the last three years since his ordination to the Diaconate, Deacon Gustavo has served here at St. Bonaventure's. We thank him and his wife Vicky for their years of presence and work as parishioners in the Hispanic community, especially for Vicky's presence on the Parish Council, and for Gustavo's service as an ordained deacon. ■ JUBILEE YEAR OF MERCY – July 31, 2016, Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time



“You fool, this night your life will be demanded of you” (Luke 12:20). Hardly sounds like mercy! Unlike some contemporary rich folks, there is no indication of lying, stealing, or cheating in Jesus’ parable. The rich man made a living, not a killing. Why does Jesus name him “fool”? First, because of presumption. Five times in nine verses, the rich man declares, “I shall.” God’s not in charge here, I am! Second, selfishness—four times, “my/myself.” No God, no neighbor; he talks to himself, about himself: my possessions, my productivity, my plans! So, instead of chasing “treasure for ourselves,” Jesus and Pope Francis’ Jubilee Year of Mercy bid us grow “rich in what matters to God” (12:21), namely, the corporal and spiritual works of mercy. Give food, drink, clothing, and healing; visit the imprisoned; bury the dead. Heal with Jesus’ own gentleness the doubt, ignorance, and sins of others; comfort, forgive, be patient; and pray for the living and dead.

■ HEALING THE HEART WORKSHOP

If you or someone you know is grieving the death of a loved one, we’d like to invite you to attend the **Healing the Heart** workshop. The workshop provides a safe place to express grief and begin healing after the loss of a loved one. Our grief companions have also lost someone who is dear to them and know the value of having someone listen with their heart. They recognize that each person’s grief is unique. The death of a loved one is unlike any other loss. Whether the death was sudden and tragic, or one with warning and preparation, the reality of death leaves most of us shocked, confused and sad. These feelings may linger for years.

The grief workshop is a six-week program characterized by trust in prayer, open sharing and spirituality. It is a Christ-centered program, but you do not have to be a member of St. Bonaventure’s parish or a Catholic to attend. It is open to anyone who has experienced the loss of a loved one. The loss may have been a recent one or a long time ago.



■ DÉCIMO OCTAVO DOMINGO DEL TIEMPO ORDINARIO, Lucas 12: 13-21

En aquel tiempo, hallándose Jesús en medio de una multitud, un hombre le dijo: “Maestro, dile a mi hermano que comparta conmigo la herencia”. Pero Jesús le contestó: “Amigo, ¿Quién me ha puesto como juez en la distribución de herencias?”

Y dirigiéndose a la multitud, dijo: “Eviten toda clase de avaricia, porque la vida del hombre no depende de la abundancia de los bienes que posea”. Después les propuso esta parábola: “Un hombre rico obtuvo una gran cosecha y se puso a pensar: ‘Qué haré, porque no tengo ya en dónde almacenar la cosecha? Ya sé lo que voy a hacer: derribaré mis graneros y construiré otros más grandes para guardar ahí mi cosecha y todo lo que tengo. Entonces podré decirme: Ya tienes bienes acumulados para muchos años; descansa, come, bebe y date a la buena vida’.

Pero Dios le dijo: ‘Insensato! Esta misma noche vas a morir. ¿Para quién serán todos tus bienes’ Lo mismo le pasa al que amontona riquezas para sí mismo y no se hace rico de lo que vale ante Dios’.

El libro del Eclesiastés, cap. 2: 21-23 nos habla que el hombre vive de una **vana ilusión**. Vive en el día con dolores; de penas, y fatigas, de noche tampoco descansa, por su vana ilusión y gran desventura, porque por más talento o habilidad que haya puesto en su trabajo para hacer fortuna tiene que dejárselo a otro cuando él muera, otro gozará lo que él hizo con tanta preocupación y el que lo gozará no trabajó. Todo es vana ilusión.

Hoy en Evangelio de Lucas nos habla de la parábola del **rico insensato**: uno de la multitud pide a Jesús que ordene a su hermano que reparta la herencia con él. No se sabe cuál fue el motivo de esta petición. Podemos relacionar esta parábola entre el hijo mayor y el hijo menor de la parábola del hijo pródigo: Lc. 15: 11-32.

Jesús primero afirma que no tiene ninguna jurisdicción en la división de las herencias, pero después advierte acerca de cuáles son las prioridades que han de estar claras al tratar tales cuestiones. **La avaricia y los intereses egoístas** pueden complicar fácilmente esta clase de pleitos.

La parábola del rico insensato presenta a un hombre para el cual la adquisición de bienes materiales se había convertido en una obsesión. Incapaz de apreciar la naturaleza transitoria de la existencia humana, él derriba sus graneros y construye otros nuevos para almacenar todos los bienes adquiridos. Pero cuando Dios llame repentinamente a este rico insensato, ¿Quién disfrutará de todas esas “cosas”?

En nuestro mundo se imitan con demasiada frecuencia las acciones del rico insensato. La mayor parte de la riqueza que depositan en otras naciones no beneficia a nadie cuando mueren, debido a las exigencias del secreto bancario. “Vana Ilusión” fue la que vivió. Por eso la Iglesia, como oráculo de Dios y voz de Jesucristo, tiene que dirigir la lucha por el arrepentimiento tanto de esas autoridades como de las instituciones bancarias que favorecen esas acciones— cambiemos el corazón y no vivamos una “Vana ilusión”. “Insensato, esta misma noche vas a morir” (Lucas 12:20). ¡Apenas suena misericordioso! A diferencia de alguna gente rica contemporánea, no hay ningún indicio de mentira, robo o hacer trampa en la parábola de Jesús. El hombre rico hizo una vida, no una matanza. ¿Por qué Jesús le dijo “Insensato”? En primer lugar, debido a la presunción. Cinco veces en nueve versos, declara el hombre rico, “haré”. ¡No cuenta con Dios! Segundo, egoísmo — cuatro veces, “mí / para mí.” En ningún momento piensa en Dios, o en los vecinos; habla para sí mismo, sobre sí mismo: ¡mis

posesiones, mi productividad, mis planes! En lugar de perseguir el “tesoro para nosotros.”

Jesús y el Papa Francisco en este Año Jubilar de la Misericordia nos invitan a “enriquecernos con lo que le importa a Dios” (12:21), es decir, en las obras corporales y espirituales de misericordia. Dar comida, bebida, ropa. Curar, visitar a los encarcelados; enterrar a los muertos. Sanar como Jesús los hizo con dulzura y sin duda, ignorando los pecados de otros. Consolar, perdonar, ser paciente; y orar por los vivos y muertos.
