■ **ADULT SACRAMENTAL INITIATION -
 RENEWING OUR PARISH DIRECTION**

Over the last few years, our need to help Catholic adults (20 years or older) has increased, and the need for greater flexibility and creativity has become paramount. It has been a challenge to give pastoral care to widening age groups, and to respond to people with very busy lives, who desire to become fully initiated Catholics but are unable to keep regular schedules.

It is apparent that we need to develop more creative, responsive and flexible processes to help the great varieties of persons who desire to belong to our community of faith, and who also belong to a family life, a working life and a school life.

We also believe that we need to join together the full range of spiritual adult formation and sacramental initiation of adults, to interconnect both realms of pastoral life in an intergenerational way.

This will change the organization planning, scheduling and celebrations of the Sacramental Initiation processes. Many details need to be worked out. **This new endeavor will become the responsibility of Eileen Limberg, with the pastoral assistance of Fr. Kevin Schindler-McGraw.**

■ **THE ERA OF SR. ANNE'S WORK
 COMES TO AN END**

The separate, stand-alone RCIA process will end and new programming will create a nine-to-ten-month intergenerational process, all coordinating with adult faith formation activities.

Holy Names Sister Anne Burgard, who is also a fellow parishioner, has completed 14 years working at St. Bonaventure as a part-time employee of the parish. As we reorganize the Adult Sacramental Initiation pastoral work, Sr. Anne's formal ministry at St. Bonaventure's ends as well.

On behalf of the parish community, I want to thank Sr. Anne for her years of service and for her continuity as a fellow parishioner. Over the years, we have seen parish ministries develop and change, and with that, change in parish personnel. That will be true as the parish enters into the future, as I retire and a new pastor is appointed.

A more formal moment to honor and thank Sr. Anne will be planned in the near future.

■ **TRANSPARENCY, BEING INFORMED
 AND NOT CREATING RUMORS**

As I have said from time to time, the reality and the truth is printed in the bulletin, not at Peets, Starbucks or on patios around the parish.

Also, there is the infamous repeating of information that is often half-heard or half-understood. Passing along information also contributes to creating incorrect rumors.

So let me be clear about two rumors being passed along as "The Truth."

1. While we welcome Fr. Kevin Schindler-McGraw as an assistant priest on a regular, full-time basis, he will never become the pastor who succeeds me. Fr. Kevin is a conventional Franciscan seeking to do pastoral work here in our community. The parish of St. Bonaventure is a diocesan parish, in which a priest of the Diocese of Oakland will be appointed pastor.
2. The role and presence of Christa Fairfield as Director of Pastoral Life does not end as I retire. It would be my hope that such a role would continue, because it allows a pastor to become more fully engaged in the pastoral-people-work of the parish. Staffing questions and personnel have both pastoral and financial ramifications. They are also part of administrative planning and budgets. All of that is part of future staff development conversations. There is nothing automatic.

■ **CHANGES IN MUSIC MINISTRIES**

Paul McWilliams, who presently works in Music Ministry at the University of San Francisco, will also become the Music Leader for the Saturday evening choir at 5:00pm.

Anthony Arteaga, our parish Director for Liturgy and Music, will become the Music Ministry Leader at the Sunday evening Mass at 5:00pm.

Julia Aguilar will be leaving the leading of these two Masses. We thank her for her last six months with us and wish her very well in teaching piano to young eager piano students.

PARISH LIFE THOUGHTS
 FROM CHRISTA FAIRFIELD

■ **EXPLORING JUSTICE: Tuesday, August 16, 7:00-9:00pm, Classroom B1**

One of the difficulties we face as Catholics is how to put Catholic Social Teaching into action – how to go about *living justice*. It is a challenge for several reasons:

- Our spirituality as Catholics and Christians is not always reflected in other social arenas, including politics, journalism, and commerce
- We are often confronted by or even support ideologies which conflict with Church teaching
- Social discourse is often lacking in peaceful dialog, prayer, and other forms of engagement which make room for the Holy Spirit

Discerning a path to justice through these types of challenges is not only difficult work, but it is also work we do not tackle very often. In an election year, the need for this type of discernment increases dramatically.

On Tuesday, August 16, from 7:00-9:00pm, Saint Bonaventure Catholic Community will be offering an evening of *Exploring Justice* - an opportunity to discern the path to social justice across our faith, family, and civic lives. This evening will be an opportunity for both dialog and prayer, for learning and sharing, and for coming together as a community (which is not necessarily the same thing as agree-

ing upon everything as a community).
 Segments will include:

- Identifying a Catholic “spirituality of justice”
- Distinguishing church teaching from ideology, and understanding how they can interact
- Forming one’s conscience on complex social justice and political topics
- Identifying the major topics of Catholic Social Teaching
- Describing the characteristics of a system of political economy which follows Catholic Social Teaching

Faith sharing and prayers for social justice will also be included.

This evening will be about integrating Catholic Social Teaching into our lives. It will not be about determining who is right and who is wrong, as defined politically. It will be about prayerful consideration of church teaching when our lives are constantly bombarded by messages which depart from those teachings. Please join us!

■ JUBILEE YEAR OF MERCY – August 7, 2016, Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time



Last Sunday’s “Parable of the rich fool” delivered a compelling reason to do the right thing—now: “You fool, this night your life will be demanded of you” (Luke 12:20).

Today, Jesus warns us: “You also must be prepared, for at an hour you do not expect, the Son of Man will come” (12:40). Though we do *not* know when our Master will come, we *do* know what our Master expects to find. Jesus expects us to be vigilant (12:37) and diligent (12:42) in our work for the kingdom, but also filled with reverent mercy toward our fellow servants and ourselves. Hopefully, Jesus’ warning not to get drunk and beat each other up (12:45) does not apply to us literally! But what changes do I need to make, right now, so that the many people outside “the Master’s house” will want to come inside to experience the healing comfort of Jesus’ own mercy in the compassion of Jesus’ modern-day disciples?

■ **DÉCIMO NOVENO DOMINGO DEL
TIEMPO ORDINARIO
7 DE AGOSTO, 2016, LUCAS 12:32-48**

En nuestras familias, y en la sociedad de hoy, enfrentamos frecuente el problema de la desconfianza. No creemos en los demás; no creemos en nosotros mismos. Nos sentimos inseguros, con miedo, casi con desesperación. En este momento, la Palabra de Dios en la Biblia nos habla de la importancia de tener fe. La segunda lectura nos presenta a Abraham como modelo de fe. Al recordar las dificultades por las que tuvo que atravesar en su vida, muy semejantes a las nuestras hoy, aprendemos a conservar la fe. Decimos que Abraham es el padre de la fe.

A Abraham no le resultó fácil ponerse en las manos de Dios y dejarse llevar así sin saber qué le iba a suceder. Un día le dice Dios a Abraham que tome a su hijo Isaac y que lo sacrifique. Abraham se dio cuenta del problema, pero creyó en Dios. El vería una solución. Tomó a su hijo y subió al Monte para sacrificarlo. En nuestras vidas hay muchas cosas aparentemente absurdas: una enfermedad, una desgracia, la pobreza, la ingratitud de alguien a quien queremos, las injusticias que nos rodean. Ante estos absurdos, muchos pierden la fe en Dios y lo rechazan, pero esto no soluciona sus problemas, sino que los complican. Los creyentes sabemos que el sacrificio tiene un valor, y que el dolor lleva a la alegría, que la muerte lleva a la vida.

ESTAMOS ESPERANDO LA PLENITUD DEL SEÑOR

De esto nos habla el Evangelio de Lucas hoy: “Estar preparados, estar listos con la túnica puesta y las lámparas encendidas” Preparados espiritualmente. Esta tarde, en espera de ese mañana, en espera de esa venida del patrón, para gozar del Reino de Dios, es la historia del mundo. Dice el Concilio: “La Iglesia, que ya inició en Cristo resucitado hace veintidós siglos la renovación del mundo, está esperando la plenitud de esta perfección con la venida del Señor”. No nos olvidemos, queridos católicos, somos los sirvientes en espera del Señor que ha de venir. ¡Ojala no lo olvidara a nadie! Ni aquellos que se han sentido dueños del mundo, porque tienen en sus manos los poderes. También ellos son

los criados del Señor que ha de venir. Y el Evangelio termina terriblemente: aquel que se le ha dado más, mayores responsabilidades, será juzgado con mayor severidad -aquel que ha recibido más y pudo hacer feliz al mundo con sus bienes, y solamente vivió de sus egoísmos, como el criado de la noche que se sintió dueño de todo lo que tenía, como si soñara. Están soñando. Vendrá el día, los despertará; y se encontrarán frente al dueño de las cosas, frente al dueño de los pueblos, frente al Señor de la historia.

Estamos esperando, y esta esperanza no es ilusión. El Concilio nos invita a dar razón de nuestra esperanza. No es una esperanza irracional. No es una esperanza que predica conformismo: “Confórmese, ya van a tener la felicidad del cielo”. No predica así la Iglesia -la Iglesia, precisamente en las lecturas de hoy, dándonos el sentido escatológico de la Iglesia. San Lucas, escribía en un ambiente pagano, donde se le da sentido a las cosas presentes, sigue dándole valor a las cosas presentes. Son bellas las cosas de la tierra; es precioso el dinero, el oro. Esa ambición, la autoridad, el poder, todo eso vale mucho. Pero San Lucas dice: sí, vale mucho. Manéjenlo, pero como quien espera a quien tiene que darle cuenta. Es lo que dice el Concilio, que ha aprendido a dialogar con este mundo presente y le dice al mundo: sí, todas las cosas de la tierra son preciosas. El amor del matrimonio es bello. La belleza de las criaturas, Dios la ha dado. Todo es hermoso, pero cuando se tiene el sentido de su trascendencia, de un Dios que las ha creado y de un Dios que ha de pedir cuenta en el uso de esas cosas. Dios les ayude. Diácono Mariano Preza
