In June, St. Bonaventure and our 'Family to Family' ministry welcomed a refugee family—the Ahmadi family from Afghanistan. The Ahmadi family consists of father and mother - Najib and Zainab respectively, along with their three children: Faisal (son), Marwa (daughter), and Bilal (son). Through your generosity we were able to get them started in their apartment with furniture, food, kitchenware, bedding, toiletries, etc. Najib is anxious to get his driver's license and find a job; and Zainab is learning English. The two oldest children are now starting school.

However, there is still much to accomplish. We need helping hands to drive to doctor's appointments; help with instructions for learning the rules of the road (driving permit and driving practice); driving the family to food pantries in the area; tutoring for the children and ESL tutoring for Zainab, along with other miscellaneous needs. Importantly, your contributions to the 'Family to Family' ministry would help supplement their rent and their everyday and monthly expenses. ■ JUBILEE YEAR OF MERCY – Twenty-fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time



Mercy is one thing, mal-practice quite another. Why, then, does the defrauded master in Jesus' parable praise the devious steward? Jesus shows by example how

to sanctify material goods: by placing all our resources, indeed our very selves, at the service of others. No matter how costly such service, or how minimal the return, such charity is the wisest investment, yielding a reward that is literally out of this world. For Amos and Jesus, authentic worship of God demands practical charity toward our neighbor. Paul, too, declares that the only worship acceptable to God is offered by a community rich in charity. Liturgy must be matched to life, "lifting up h oly hands, without anger or argument" (1 Timothy 2:8). This *Jubilee Year of Mercy* challenges us to live as "children of light," as devoted to self-sacrificing service as "the children of this world" (Luke 16:8) are to serving themselves, as enthusiastic for God's kingdom of justice as we are about less-enduring treasures.

CHILDREN AND YOUTH**

**■ REGISTRATION FOR RELIGIOUS
EDUCATION CLASSES**

St. Bonaventure's religious education classes will begin the week of October 2. Our Faith Formation programs begin with children as young as age 4 and kindergarten and continue through high school.

We offer a Sunday morning program for pre-school age 4 and kindergarten-age children that meets during the 9am Mass. This program is designed to share stories from the Bible and to engage the youngest of our community to grow in their faith, with interactive activities. We also offer classes after school during the week for students who are in the 1st through 5th grade. The Jr. High program meets on Thursday from 7-8:30pm. Confirmation/High School meets on Sunday. Each grade builds on the child's faith journey with Jesus. This includes preparation for the sacraments of our faith. We will share the weekly Gospel with students to increase their awareness of Jesus' life and teachings. We will talk about the foundations of our Catholic faith, how we live it and how we build that faith to become who Jesus wants us to be.

We will meet your child wherever they are in their faith journey, with class offerings for Baptism, First Communion, Reconciliation and Confirmation. We also have Sacramental Preparation classes that are taught in Spanish.

Registration for Faith Formation Classes has begun. You are able to register in the church office from the hours of 9am to 4pm Monday through Friday (we are closed from 12:30-1:30pm daily). Doors of Mercy: Exploring God's Covenant with You is an 8-week scriptural journey through salvation history, from God's merciful promises to Adam, Noah, Abraham, Moses, and David, to the prophets' call to renewal, to the fulfillment of God's promises in Christ.

Luke: The Gospel of Mercy is an 18-week study of the third Gospel, which is both a beautiful portrait of Our Lord Jesus Christ and a summons to draw closer to him. St Luke returns again and again to the theme of Divine Mercy – God's offer of forgiveness, reconciliation and transformation.

Together these two studies, along with additional short presentations, movies and class retreats, will give you a better understanding of the Mercy in the Bible, the Gospel of Luke and Salvation History. ■ CARING HANDS: REACHING OUT TO OUR SENIORS

Life at any age involves challenges, but these intensify as we age. The first concern may be that it becomes too difficult to drive to the doctor or the grocery, or to just get a haircut. Support systems change, neighbors and friends may not help as expected, and loneliness may put a damper on daily routine.

Caring Hands volunteers offer friendship which makes an extraordinary difference in the quality of life for many of our seniors.

Caring Hands Volunteer Caregivers Program, a collaborative community outreach program between John Muir Health, social service agencies, congregations of various faiths and the community-at-large, creates finely-tuned one-on-one matches. The Caring Hands Program is dedicated to helping aging adults in Contra Costa County remain independent as long as safely possible. Isolation and loneliness shorten lives and may make health problems worse.

If making time to volunteer is on your to-do list, consider joining Caring Hands as a caregiver or even as an occasional driver. Enriching matches are created; loving friendships and deep relationships are formed. Care receivers treasure a friendly visit, a walk in the park, or other social outing. Reading mail, letter writing, or providing respite care to give a break to a family member are thoughtful services which can make a big difference to a frail or isolated senior.

Since so many older adults need transportation to doctor's appointments or stores, the best volunteer for Caring Hands is someone who is available once a week for 1-3 hours on a weekday, and who can provide transportation. Volunteers receive ongoing education, support and recognition of their efforts.

Perhaps you can be that friend who gives a waiting senior hope and help. The next training session in Walnut Creek will be held on **Friday, September 23** from 9:00 -2:30, at the John Muir Health Medical Center. ■ LUCAS 16,1-13

En aquel tiempo, Jesús dijo a sus discípulos: El que es fiel en las cosas pequeñas, también es fiel en las cosas grandes; y el que es infiel en las cosas pequeñas, también es infiel en las cosas grandes. Si ustedes no son fieles administradores del dinero, tan lleno de injusticias, ¿Quién les confiará los bienes verdaderos? Y si no han sido fieles en lo que no es de ustedes, ¿Quién les confiará lo que sí es de ustedes?

No hay criado que pueda servir a dos amos, pues odiará a uno y amará al otro, o se apegará al primero y despreciará al segundo. En resumen, no pueden ustedes servir a Dios y al dinero."

Hay gente que su único motivo para vivir es el conseguir dinero. Cuando hablamos con ellos una y otra vez y de mil formas solapadas aparece siempre el tema de la fortuna material. Son personas donde funciona a la perfección el "eres lo que tienes..."

Muchas personas son capaces de hacer cualquier cosa por dinero, porque encuentran en él una seguridad que nadie ni nada le puede ofrecer.

Hoy la palabra nos habla de un administrador infiel, de un mal administrador. Jesús nos pone este ejemplo no para que sigamos sus pasos de injusta trayectoria. Lo que nos quiere hacer ver es la astucia que pone la gente del mundo en sus negocios e intereses. La dedicación de muchas personas a conseguir bienes materiales muchas veces puede ser un estorbo que nos impida llegar a los bienes de Dios. No olvidemos esto nunca.

Los cristianos tenemos que plantearnos el papel del dinero en nuestra vida. Hay algunos que lo satanizan, otros lo divinizan, pero creo que la cosa no está en lo uno o en lo otro. Hay que poner el dinero donde debe estar; puede que lo necesitemos en muchos sitios y aspectos de nuestra vida, pero donde seguro que **nunca tiene que estar el dinero es en el interior del corazón.**

Cuando vivimos demasiado apegados a la fortuna material nos podemos olvidar con facilidad de otras fortunas más importantes: el ser hijo/a de Dios; el tener fe; el luchar por los demás... Ante esto el Evangelio nos da un toque de atención y nos hace preguntar por qué hay tantos cristianos que tienen tan poco entusiasmo en sembrar el mensaje de Jesús y tanta urgencia para las cosas materiales.

Nuestro sagaz administrador convierte a los deudores de su amo en amigos suyos. Para las cosas del mundo la gente sabe moverse, es astuta, no les importa sacrificarse. En los negocios del mundo las ganancias son siempre temporales; en las cosas de Dios las ganancias son eternas.

Todo cuanto poseemos y las personas que tenemos a nuestro alrededor es propiedad de Dios. Decimos con facilidad "mi padre", "mi madre", "mi hijo/a", "mi esposa". Más bien tenemos que decir "el padre, el hijo, el esposo, la esposa que Dios me ha prestado..." Perder de vista el único dueño nos hace caer en estados depresivos cuando llegan los duros momentos de la muerte de nuestros seres queridos. ¿Para qué Dios nos presta a estas personas? Para que juntos podamos hacer nuestro camino hacia El. De ahí que la familia verdadera de Jesús no es según la carne y la sangre sino desde el Espíritu de Dios. Ver a los demás y lo que poseemos como préstamos de Dios es dejar que sea El quién nos haga comprender las relaciones humanas a los niveles más profundos.

Con dinero podemos hacer mucho bien o mucho mal, depende el uso que le demos; pero también es cierto que el preciado metal puede meterse en nuestro corazón haciéndonos creer que es lo más importante en la vida. Cuando esto sucede en una persona no significa que tenga dinero, sino que el dinero es quien le tiene bien atrapado.

Somos administradores de la riqueza que Dios ha puesto en nuestras manos. Mantenernos cerca del Señor es el mejor antídoto contra el veneno que nos puede inocular el dinero y las riquezas materiales.
