Taize music comes from the Taize community in France. This community is an ecumenical monastery that began in WWII as a refuge for orphaned youth. The service is mostly meditative chant (meaning the simple phrases are sung repeatedly) interspersed with quiet time to allow for personal prayer and reflection. LIFE AND JUSTICE

ASH WEDNESDAY STATEMENT FROM CA BISHOPS ON IMMIGRATION

(Sacramento, CA) Today marks the beginning of the Lenten Season, a time when Christian people devote ourselves more intentionally to the spiritual and corporal works of mercy in an earnest effort to reform our lives in the image of Jesus Christ. We use this occasion to call upon Catholics and all people of good will in California and throughout the United States to stand in solidarity with the vulnerable and excluded in our society. Urgent attention needs to be given to our neighbors who are migrants and refugees, especially those immigrants who are undocumented. They are being unjustly targeted and vilified.

We are deeply concerned about the possibility of widespread deportations that will break up families and break down our communities. Fear is now growing in our neighborhoods and schools. The work of businesses and farms is being disrupted. We seem to be turning away from our nation's long history of renewal and innovation inspired by successive generations of immigrants and refugees. We are a nation of immigrants. We have a long history of welcoming those fleeing violence in other countries. We should not turn our back on this proud legacy, especially in this current moment in our history.

As pastors, we witness firsthand every day the fear in our communities. We call upon the new Administration and Congress in Washington to do everything in their power to ease the climate of fear that is now gripping our communities. It is long past time for our leaders to stop allowing this issue to be used for political advantage and set themselves to the task of fixing our broken immigration system. The principles and priorities for immigration reform are well-known and they are reasonable. We urgently need reforms in our visa and guest worker programs. We need reforms that keep families together and recognize that those who are detained

already have the legal right of due process. We need to provide those who are here and contribute to our economy and society, but without documentation, an immediate path to regularize their status, with an eye to one day becoming citizens.

Some concrete measures are already under consideration. In Congress, the Federal BRIDGE Act, S.128/H.R, 496, for instance, will protect DACA students (Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals). In Sacramento, the California Values Act, SB 54, would protect the safety and well-being of all Californians by ensuring that state and local resources are not used to assist in deportations that would separate families. It would also do so by having the effect of reducing crime, since undocumented persons would not fear approaching a law enforcement office to report a crime. We support these proposals as well as other reasonable steps to address immigration in a compassionate, thoughtful manner, and we encourage our political leaders to find bi-partisan solutions.

The Catholic bishops of California and the United States support the federal government's obligation to protect our borders and to uphold our immigration laws. We also hold that these legal principles should always be at the service of human dignity and the common good of society. The current immigration system is gravely flawed. And because it is gravely flawed, the current push to increase enforcement and deportations — without first reforming the underlying system — can only lead to further violations of human rights and human dignity.

Just as the Church works to protect the life of the unborn and to support the unemployed, the homeless and the hungry, so we pledge our continued support to migration and refugee programs. Our parishes and social services, such as Catholic Charities, must remain in solidarity with our suffering brothers and sisters. We ask all people of faith to work with their neighbors to welcome and accompany those who are afraid and uncertain. We need to try to better understand and empathize with one another. Recognizing that we all share the same human hopes and desires will help us bravely respond to the anxious uncertainty in ourselves and the nation.

During this Lenten Season, we will hear the familiar refrain from Psalm 95, "If today you hear his voice, harden not your hearts." The Lord God always hears the cry of the poor. God is all merciful and we are judged by how we see, hear, and act in accordance with that mercy. May our fasting, penance, charity and solidarity help us to live as one people under God's merciful gaze.

"My food is to do the will of the one who sent me and to finish his work." In 4: 5-42

Jesus meets the Samaritan woman at Jacob's well. They talk, and to her astonishment and embarrassment, he reveals certain things about her life. She immediately runs to town to tell the people about this man. When his apostles want him to eat something, Jesus answers that he has his food in having done the will of the Father. He had redeemed the woman.

He speaks to us in varied ways-maybe with a passage from the Scriptures, or through our spiritual directors. "Your house and your kingdom shall endure forever before me; your throne shall stand firm forever." 2 Sm 7:4-5a, 12-14a

The message of the Lord to Nathan to give to King David was full of promise. Among them, he would raise up his heir after him; he would make his kingdom firm. To Joseph, also, could be applied these promises. He was the adopted father of Jesus, but nonetheless he raised him as his own. When Joseph died, little did he know that his adopted son would establish a kingdom that would "stand firm forever."

Joseph took upon himself a responsibility that not many other men would. Anyone can adopt a son as their own, but the Son of God? Is it any wonder that this man is the patron of the universal church? It is only fitting that he protects that which Jesus has founded. May all men look to Joseph and imitate his virtues!



March 21 Tuesday

"Lord, if my brother sins against me, how many times must I forgive him?" Mt 18: 21-35

Peter's question draws an answer from Jesus that for the people of his day wasn't easy to deal with. Should Peter forgive his brother seven times? No. He should forgive him seventy-seven times. We can find this number in Genesis, at the conclusion of Chapter Four. What matters is that just as God is unlimited in forgiveness towards us, so must we be with our brothers.

We have to do some serious thinking here. We must forgive just as God forgives us. We say this every time we recite the Lord's Prayer. But perhaps Jesus had another reason, too. When we are filled with nonforgiveness towards a person, our health pays the price. Is it worth it? Is it easy to forgive? No. But do we really have a choice?



March 22 Wednesday

"For what great nation is there that has gods so close to it as the Lord, our God..." Dt 4: 1, 5-9

In his discourses to the people, Moses exhorts, corrects, and sometimes threatens. Most of all, he reminds his people that they are the chosen of the Lord and as such they should obey, be loyal, and love the Lord. Because they are the chosen ones, their Lord is close to them. He reminds them that no other nation has this privilege.

We also are privileged because, just like Moses and the people of Israel, we have God. We may not see a pillar of cloud, the sign of God's presence, as Moses and the people saw, but we have so much more. We have his Son Jesus, sent to us, to redeem us with his blood. Not only is our Lord present in a tabernacle, but he is present in us when we receive the Eucharist, no matter where we are. God cannot come any closer than that!




March 23 Thursday

"Faithfulness has disappeared; the word itself is banished from their speech." Lk 11: 14-23

The Lord God gives a stinging message to Jeremiah, the prophet. We have only to read the entire passage. The people had turned away from God. Jeremiah was to call them back to him, but it was no easy thing to redirect their hearts. Not even the prophets before him were successful. Faithfulness had disappeared.

Faithfulness is a word that holds so much meaning and yet becomes nothing by our actions. More than ever at this moment, we have seen faithfulness disappear. Let alone in areas of our lives, but even in our leaders. Faithfulness is being true to what



makes a people great. Not in escalating arms, but in justice, protecting our elderly, protecting the unborn, not turning our backs on the marginalized because of their race, creed or sexual orientation. Faithfulness means protecting our planet, the beauty that God has created, not just for us but for future generations. Let us pray that faithfulness be restored. We are in sore need of it!



March 24 Friday

"Return, O Israel, to the Lord, your God;" Hos 14: 2-10

Hosea was believed to be a prophet or a priest; no one knows for sure. What is known was his marriage to an unfaithful woman. Between anger and tenderness, Hosea's personal tragedy influenced his vocation to bring an unfaithful Israel back to her Lord.

The book of Hosea speaks of fidelity, of love even under the most painful circumstances. Maybe in reading this scripture passage, we too can learn from it. Our infidelity to God lies in our actions towards one another. As Christians, we are called to fight against everything that separates us from God's love and that of our neighbor.



March 25 Saturday THE ANNUNCIATION OF THE LORD

"Behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you shall name him Jesus." Lk 1: 26-38

Today we return to the Infancy Narrative where the angel Gabriel announces to Mary that she will bear the Son of the Most High God. Because of her "yes", we have become partakers in eternal life. We have the gates of heaven open before us where before, because of man's infidelity, they were closed. The reason for the incarnation and the birth of our Lord lies in these forty days of Lent.

Mary was a humble, young teenager in Nazareth. Her only desire was to be totally faithful to God, and for this, she was rewarded. Her reward opened the doors of salvation for everyone. This Lent, may we be more aware of this precious gift of salvation!

LENTEN REGULATIONS ON FAST AND ABSTINENCE

Abstinence from meat is observed on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and all the Fridays of Lent by all Catholics 14 and older.

Fasting is observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59. Those bound by this rule may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted as necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.

CATHOLIC RELIEF SERVICE (CRS) RICE BOWL



For more than 40 years, CRS Rice Bowl has been a Lenten faith-inaction program for families and faith communities. Growing up, I remember the bowls that sat in the center of our kitchen table. One meal a week would be a

"simpler meal" and the money saved would be put in the bowl. On Palm Sunday, we'd bring the bowl back to church and see the pile stack up. Stewardship is more than talent and time. It also includes treasure. Together, we can make a difference in our community and in our world. Twenty-five percent of everything collected is kept in the diocese for programs where we live. Our own St. Vincent de Paul chapter has been a recent recipient. Give up one latte a week and put the extra change in the rice bowl – lead your children by your own good example.

Every week, CRS introduces us to a family and recipe from the different countries that benefit from Rice Bowl. March 19-25 we Encounter Fernando from El Salvador. Fernando dreams of becoming a businessman. He also dreams of a better future for his family and this motivates him to sell cookbooks on San Salvador buses. It is dangerous work for \$10/day, as gangs frequently stop and harass drivers and passengers.

Fernando is a graduate of *YouthBuild*, a CRS sponsored program that trains young people in business. There, he found a positive community to help him pursue his passion, despite the challenges of life in El Salvador. Training for 6 months wasn't easy on Fernando or his family. Without his wife's support and care for their two young daughters, the early mornings and long days might have been impossible. "*YouthBuild* is a family because families help you realize your dreams," Fernando says.


