THOUGHTS FROM FR. RICHARD PENSAMIENTOS DE PADRE <u>RICARDO</u>

■ WORLD NOT TO END MAY 13

I think that I can say with 99% certainty that the world is not going to end next week, May 13, on the centenary of the appearance of Our Lady of Fatima. Who is spreading the prophetic, upsetting word that it will?

Last week, a parishioner telephoned in tears, loudly crying that somehow, because of Russians stirring up fear, the warnings of Fatima and its third secret yet to be fulfilled, that the world was going to end. The person was totally panicked.

This is one Catholic who has evidently been listening to some self-proclaimed interpreters that **the vision of the third secret is about to be fulfilled.** There is an excellent three-page article in the May issue of the **St. Anthony Messenger** about the third secret of Fatima and the importance of understanding it in the context of the early 1900's.

Instead of wringing hands that the word is going to end, we need to remember the simple things that Mary the mother of Jesus says whenever she appears anywhere: there is always an "exhortation to pray" as the path of 'salvation for souls' and, likewise; "the summons to penance and conversion." ("The Third Secret of Fatima" by Donna-Marie Cooper O'Boyle)

St. Pope John Paul II revealed "the third secret" on May 13, 2000, 17 years ago, which immediately sparked all kinds of skepticism and speculation. Was it the real letter? Was it complete? Was it authentic? Sr. Lucia Dos Santos, the oldest and only living seer, confirmed that the letter opened and revealed by Pope John Paul II was authentic. She had written her recollection of what was told to the three young children, of whom she was one, in 1943 at the request of the local bishop of Leiria, Portugal. From that time, until the year 2000, the letter remained in the archives of the Congregation for the Doctrine of Faith.

Why was it kept a secret for such a long time? Perhaps because of the questions it would raise or because of the many ways that it could be misinterpreted. Certainly, Pope John Paul II identified with the prophecy because he was shot in St. Peter's Square, but he was not killed as the prophecy said that such a Pope would be.

The interpretation of the third secret from the Congregation of Faith presided over by Cardinal Joseph Ratzinger, later Pope Benedict XVI, states that the reading and revealing of the third secret "brings to an end a period of history marked by tragic human lust for power and evil, yet pervaded by the merciful love of God and the watchful care of the Mother of Jesus and of the church. The action of God, the Lord of History, and the co-responsibility of man in the drama of his creative freedom, are the two pillars upon which human history is built. Our Lady, who appeared at Fatima, recalls these forgotten values. She reminds us that man's future is in God, and we are active and responsible partners in creating that future."

(You can read the third secret in its entirety on the pullout of today's bulletin.)

Cardinal Ratzinger wrote also at the time that a careful reading of the third secret "will probably prove disappointing or surprising after all the speculation it has stirred." No great mystery is revealed; nor is the future revealed. We see the Church of the martyrs of the century which has just passed represented in a scene described in a language which is symbolic and not easy to decipher. You can read the text of Cardinal Ratzinger, "The Message of Fatima" on the Vatican website (Vatican.va).

I remember well from the mid 1940's that Our Lady of Fatima was the primary story and devotion talked about in Catholic schools and catechism classes, instilling a great deal of anxiety and fear about Russia and Communism then, and the end of the world. It is still remembered today by older Catholics of my generation.

As we remember the centenary of The Blessed Virgin Mary at Fatima 100 years ago, we must discover a present reminder for a deeper spirituality founded in the Gospel of Jesus, and in living authentic Christian lives, grounded in a human and spiritual solidarity with all human beings and fostered by a life-giving and real tenderness, which is the life blood of all people of good will.

I was reared in the spiritual tradition of Our Lady of Fatima. I have visited the sanctuary of Our Lady of Fatima twice. I lived among the Portuguese community of San Leandro-Hayward for 14 years. I have walked in procession in the twice-yearly candlelight celebrations on October 13 and May 13.

Our Lady of Fatima does not stand alone. She stands with Jesus her son because she is his mother. She would be the first one to thank us for paying attention to her role, which attracts us to her, but she would want us also to pay absolute and entire attention to Jesus. That is what God the Father said as well. "This is my beloved Son: Listen to Him." That is the real message of Fatima!

There is certainly a lot going on in the world which stirs up our fears today: rhetoric from world leaders trying to win elections, North Korea's increasing tensions in Asia, a Syrian President holding on to power, creating the greatest refugee problem in the world today, all forms of political extremism. Is the world coming to an end? It could if world leaders blow everything up and annihilate everyone and everything?

All of this can contribute to fear and anxiety. Or we follow the instincts of common sense and a living faith in God, using our freedom, goodwill and ancient faith that good triumphs over evil, to stabilize and transform the present. Perhaps Our Lady of Fatima can stimulate our spiritual and practical imaginations.

- Visiting the sick or homebound



■ CATHOLICISM: PIVOTAL PLAYERS





The Meaning of Fatima — 100 Years Later



OUR LADY OF FATIMA

St. Bonaventure Parish Community remembers the Apparitions of the Blessed Virgin Mary 100 years ago that began on May 13, 1917. In three separate Masses, reflections by Fr. T.C. George and a movie on May 11, 12, and 13, we will consecrate ourselves to Jesus and to Mary, the First Disciple of Jesus on Mother's Day weekend.

The Third Secret of Fatima

"J.M.J. The third part of the secret revealed at the Cova da Iria-Fátima, on July 13, 1917.

"I write in obedience to you, my God, who commands me to do so through his Excellency the bishop of Leiria and through your Most Holy Mother and mine."

"After the two parts which I have already explained, at the left of Our Lady and a little above, we saw an angel with a flaming sword in his left hand; flashing, it gave out flames that looked as though they would set the world on fire; but they died out in contact with the splendor that Our Lady radiated toward him from her right hand: pointing to the earth with his right hand, the angel cried out in a loud voice: *Penance, Penance, Penance!*" And we saw in an immense light that is God: 'something similar to how people appear in a mirror when they pass in front of it', a bishop dressed in white. 'We had the impression that it was the Holy Father.'

"Other bishops, priests, men and women religious going up a steep mountain, at the top of which there was a big cross of rough-hewn trunks as of a cork tree with the bark; before reaching there the Holy Father passed through a big city half in ruins and half trembling with halting step, afflicted with pain and sorrow, he prayed for the souls of the corpses he met on his way; having reached the top of the mountain, on his knees at the foot of the big cross he was killed by a group of soldiers who fired bullets and arrows at him, and in the same way there died one after another the other bishops, priests, men and women religious, and various lay people of different ranks and positions. Beneath the two arms of the cross there were two angels each with a crystal aspersorium in his hand, in which they gathered up the blood of the martyrs and with it sprinkled the souls that were making their way to God."

MARY WAITS FOR PENTECOST

Thursday, May 11, 9:00am Mass

After the Ascension of Jesus, the disciples of Jesus return to Jerusalem to the Upper Room. "All these joined in continuous prayer, together with several women, including Mary the Mother of Jesus." (Acts 1:12-14)

10:00 am :Talk by Fr. T.C. George "Mary as Mother, Jesus as Son, God as our Father - the procession of the Spiritual Life. We all belong to God."

MARY'S RADICAL INVITATION

My Confirmation name is Bernadette. You would think it's because I knew something about her or because of her relationship to Mary. But no, I was a middle-schooler who had just been relocated here from Chicago and I didn't want to be here. I was hopelessly homesick and my "home" parish was St. Bernadette's.

Fast forward 25 years and I'm in the Diocese of Santa Rosa. My boss, an Irish Sister of Mercy, asks if I'm going to the Rosary for someone who has just passed away. My response, without really thinking, was "I don't do rosaries." There was a startled pause. I then had to clarify. I knew the prayers and the rubrics, but didn't know how to do a "group" rosary. Plus, I didn't really think I even had one at home. Within a week, Sr. Olive had given me a rosary and we were in the Chapel "doing the rosary."

A few years later I'm in grad school and one of my friends is writing her thesis on Mary. Not the Mary I was used to, but a radical Mary. And for the first time in my life, a Mary I could relate to. Don't get me wrong - I've always loved Mary. She's Jesus' mother, after all. My mom's birthday is the Feast of the Immaculate Conception. But I never felt connected to her. Not until that moment.

The Mary that I carry with me now grew out of that discussion. She is a young, Jewish woman of color. She's Middle Eastern. She doesn't look anything like me. She did not piously say "Yes" to God. She shouted her "Yes" knowing full well that she could be stoned if Joseph put her aside.

Mary was an activist. She knew of God's Grace and the need of it in the world. She also knew that we, his people, needed to step up and be the conduits. Read Mary's Magnificat in Luke 1:46-55. "...he has lifted up the lowly; he has filled the hungry with good things, and sent the rich away empty." (52-53)

Throughout Mary's life she advocated for others. At the Wedding at Cana, she was more concerned for the host than she was for herself. She didn't ask, but told Jesus to take care of things. Mary was with the apostles in the upper room, praying. She was there at Pentecost. She was filled with the Holy Spirit and tasked to spread the Word throughout the world.

Mary continues to be the conduit through which God's wish for the world is shown to us. By following her radical invitation to engage with and help those in need, we grow closer to God. We work to make this his Kingdom on earth.

Reflecting on my chosen Confirmation name, I have to say "I grew into the name." The Holy Spirit truly does work in mysterious ways.

It was in a neighborhood "Rosary group" when I first met Mama Mary. As a teenager, I did not think much of it. But as the years went by that initial relationship bloomed.


As a young girl, I learned that my identity, above all things, is that "I am the Beloved Daughter of God" and if I truly



■ EL MUNDO NO TERMINA EL 13 DE MAYO

Yo pienso y con certeza y puedo decir con un 99% que el mundo no se va acabar la semana que viene, el 13 de Mayo en el centenario de la aparición de la Virgen de Fátima. ¿Quién está corriendo la voz profética, que va ha suceder?

La semana pasada un feligrés me llamó por teléfono llorando en voz alta que de alguna manera debido a los Rusos que están metiendo el miedo, las advertencias de Fátima y su tercer secreto que aún deben cumplirse, que el mundo se va acabar. La persona estaba con mucho pánico.

Ella es una católica que, evidentemente, ha estado escuchando algunos intérpretes autoproclamados que la visión del tercer secreto está a punto de cumplirse. Hay un excelente artículo de tres páginas en la edición de San Antonio el Mensajero sobre el tercer secreto de Fátima y de la importancia de comprenderlo en el contexto del principio de 1900's

En lugar de retorcerse las manos con la palabra que el mundo se va acabar, tenemos que recordar las cosas simples que María la madre de Jesús dice cada vez que se aparece en cualquier lugar: siempre hay una "exhortación a orar como el camino de la salvación de las almas y del mismo modo; el llamado a la penitencia y a la conversión." (El Tercer Secreto de Fátima por Donna-Marie Cooper O'Boyle)

San Juan Pablo II reveló el tercer secreto el 13 de Mayo de 2000, hace 17 años, lo que provocó de inmediato todo tipo de duda y especulación. ¿Era la carta de verdad? ¿Era completa? ¿Era auténtica? Sor Lucía Dos Santos, la mayor de los que la vieron, confirmó que la carta abierta y revelada por el Papa Juan Pablo II era auténtica. Ella escribió su recolección de lo que se les dijo a los tres niños pequeños, ella era una de ellos, en 1943 a petición del obispo local de Leiria, Portugal. Desde ese tiempo hasta el año 2000, la carta se mantuvo en los archivos de la Congregación para la Doctrina de la fe.

¿Por qué se mantuvo en secreto tanto tiempo? Tal vez debido a las preguntas que ocasionaría en el mundo o quizás por



las malas interpretaciones. Ciertamente, el Papa Juan Pablo II identificó la profecía cuando le dispararon en la plaza de San Pedro, pero no lo mataron como la profecía decía que a un Papa le pasaría.

La interpretación del tercer secreto de la Congregación de la Fe, presidida por el Cardinal Joseph Ratzinger, futuro Papa Benedicto XVI, establece que la lectura y la revelación del tercer secreto " pone fin a un periodo de la historia marcada por la trágica voluntad humana de poder y mal, pero impregnada del amor misericordioso de Dios y el cuidado estricto de la Madre de Jesús y de la iglesia. La acción de Dios, el Señor de la historia, y la co-responsabilidad del hombre en el drama de su libertad creativa, son los pilares sobre los que se construye la historia humana. Nuestra Señora que se apareció en Fátima, recuerda estos valores olvidados. Ella nos recuerda que el futuro del hombre está en Dios y somos socios activos y responsables en la creación de ese futuro.

El Cardinal Ratzinger escribió también en ese tiempo, que después de una lectura cuidadosa del tercer secreto "probablemente desilusionado o asombrado después de todas las especulaciones que se han hecho." No es un gran misterio el que se ha revelado; ni tampoco el futuro se ha revelado. Vemos la iglesia de los mártires del siglo que acaba de pasar representada en una escena descrita en un lenguaje que es simbólico pero difícil de describir. Ustedes pueden leer el texto del Cardenal Ratzinger, "El Mensaje de Fátima" en el sitio web del Vaticano (Vatican.va).

Recuerdo bien que a mediados de la década de 1940 la Virgen de Fátima fue la historia principal y devoción que se hablaba en las escuelas católicas y en las clases de catecismo inculcando una gran ansiedad y temor acerca de Rusia, el Comunismo y el fin del mundo. Todavía es recordado por la generación de católicos mayores de mi edad.

Al recordar el centenario de la Bendita Virgen Maria de Fátima, debemos descubrir una espiritualidad más profunda encontrada en el Evangelio de Jesús y la vida auténtica cristiana basada en una solidaridad humana y espiritual con todos los seres humanos y fomentado por un dador de vida con verdadera ternura que es la sangre de la vida de todas las personas de buena voluntad. Me crie en la tradición espiritual de la Virgen de Fátima. He visitado el santuario de la Virgen de Fátima en dos ocasiones. Viví entre la comunidad Portuguesa de San Leandro-Hayward durante 14 años. He caminado en procesión con velas en las dos celebraciones anuales, el 13 de Mayo y el 13 de Octubre.

La Virgen de Fátima no está sola. Ella se encuentra con Jesús su hijo porque ella es su madre. Ella sería la primera en darnos las gracias por prestar atención a su papel que nos atrae a ella, pero ella quiere también que nosotros demos absoluta atención a Jesús. Eso es lo que Dios el Padre dijo también. "Este es mi Hijo amado: escúchenlo." ¡Ese es el verdadero mensaje de Fátima!

Sin duda hoy está pasando mucho en el mundo que despierta nuestros temores: La retórica de los líderes mundiales tratando de ganar las elecciones, Corea del Norte aumentando las tensiones en Asia, el Presidente de Syria que se mantiene en el poder creando el problema de los refugiados en el mundo, todas las formas de la política extrema. ¿Está el mundo llegando a su fin? Podría si los líderes mundiales vuelan todo y nos aniquilan a todos.

Todo esto puede contribuir al miedo y la ansiedad. O seguimos nuestros instintos del sentido común y vivir con fe en Dios, usando nuestra libertad, la buena voluntad, la fe antigua de que el bien triunfa sobre el mal para estabilizar y transformar el presente. Tal vez la Virgen de Fátima pueda estimular nuestra imaginación y prácticas espirituales.
