THOUGHTS FROM FR. OSCAR ROJAS

THE PREFERENTIAL OPTION FOR THE POOR

Jesus announced his message of the good news to all. Jesus' message is one of hope, love and peace. This news is unwelcome to many who have authority and power to lead society - those who have oppressed the defenseless and vulnerable. However, Jesus presents his plan of salvation for the oppressed, impoverished, excluded and marginalized. He does not exclude anyone. Jesus comes near, dialogues, and defends the simple people, to restore the dignitu of those who were being humiliated and oppressed, insisting instead on the preferential option for the poor. Our faith proclaims that "Jesus Christ is the human face of God and the divine face of man." That is why "the preferential option for the poor is implicit in the Christological faith in that God who has become poor for us, to enrich us with his poverty" (Aparecida 392). Jesus, being the Son of God, does not boast of his condition. He had the power and the authority, and still he became like us. That is Jesus' way of showing us through actions and deeds the true meaning of love and peace. Jesus invites us to become true men and women committed to God's plan of salvation. The issues of our time continue to be the same as in Jesus' time. Therefore. we should follow Jesus' loving care for the helpless and vulnerable.

The true followers of Jesus are called to embrace the preferential option for the poor and restore their dignity. We should commit ourselves to be faithful witnesses of the message of hope for men and women in our society, because the world constantly challenges us by displaying ways of life different from that which Jesus wants. We see very serious abuses of human rights by governments. There are so many injustices, oppressing the defenseless with the power which that same people have granted them. But those in power should use their power to serve people. In the first reading of the book of wisdom we find a wonderful example: "I prayed, and prudence was given

me; I pleaded, and the spirit of wisdom came to me." The heads of state, lead-



ers, lawyers of all nations should embrace humility, love, and peace and open their hearts and implore prudence and the spirit of wisdom to support the welfare of society. Throughout history we have discovered inhuman acts committed by those in authority. Today the Church is overjoyed with the canonization of Bishop Romero. He was an archbishop of El Salvador, and today he officially became a saint for the Universal Church. The Salvadoran people have always waited joyfully for this day, although for many Salvadorans he has already been a saint. Romero was assassinated on March 24, 1980 by the Salvadoran government while presiding at a Mass at the Divina Providencia Hospital. "Bishop Romero understood that as a Christian, as a bishop, he could not be silenced by the daily injustices he saw in his country. And chose the poor people in his country whom he defended. From the poor he discovered that God is theirs, is their defender and liberator; among the poor he discovered that God is the God dwarfed, cult, suffering and crucified. This made him also delve into the mystery of a God always greatest, transcendent, the last reserve of truth, of goodness, of humility, with which we count human beings."

In today's Gospel of Mark, a man approached Jesus and asked him, "What must I do to attain eternal life?" Jesus tells him you already know the commandments. The man says "Master, all that I have fulfilled since I was young." Jesus said; "You are lacking in one thing. Go, sell what you have, and give to the poor and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me. At that statement his face fell, and he went away sad, for he had many possessions." Jesus presents us a man who was not able to get rid of his possessions to help the poor. He was so attached that he was

not able to follow Jesus. Bishop Romero is called the voice of the voiceless because he spoke on behalf of the oppressed, mistreated, humiliated, and innocent, and was assassinated for that. He gave testimonu of Christ' love, shedding his blood for the salvation of his people. Now, let us examine ourselves to see if we are embracing the preferential option for the poor. We may not be rich enough to sell things, but we can become defenders, protectors of justice and take a stand for the rights of vulnerable people. "Brothers, they are from our own people, kill your own peasant and due to an order to kill given by man, must prevail the law of God that says do not kill. None of the soldiers are obliged to obey an order against the law of God" (Bishop Romero). Let us built a community of love, peace and harmonu.

WALKING THROUGH THE DOOR: AN INVITATION FOR SEXUAL ABUSE SURVIVORS, FAMILY & FRIENDS

How have the ongoing disclosures of sexual abuse and cover-ups in the Church affected our faith and our trust? How can we help and support each other during this time? On October 1st we held our first meeting for sexual abuse survivors, family, and friends. Although everyone agreed it was extremely difficult to gather the courage to walk in the door, the meeting was a wonderful testimony to the power of God's healing grace. Younger and older, male and female, with different experiences of assaults, and abusers who included clergy, family, acquaintances and strangers — yet the commonalities outweighed these differences. For many people it was their first opportunity to meet other survivors and share whatever felt comfortable in a group setting.

Our next meeting is Wednesday, November 7 at 7pm in the Rectory Conference Room. All survivors, family, and friends are welcome. This group may continue as a series of occasional gatherings, or this may be the beginning of a ministry. Come and see where the Spirit leads us. 

LA OPCIÓN PREFERENCIAL POR LOS POBRES

Jesús anuncia su mensaje de buena nueva a los pueblos. El mensaje que Jesús anuncio es un mensaje de esperanza, amor y de paz. Este mensaje trae conflicto, especialmente a aquellos que tienen el poder para dirigir la sociedad. Aquellos que ocupaban posiciones de poder oprimían a la gente indefensa y vulnerable. Sin embargo, Jesús viene a presentar su plan de salvación a favor de los oprimidos, empobrecidos, excluidos y marginados. Jesús no excluye a nadie. Jesús se acerca, dialoga y defiende a la gente sencilla. Jesús viene a restaurar la dignidad de aquellos que estaban siendo humillados y violentados en sus derechos de ser humano. Jesús hace una opción preferencial por los pobres y "Nuestra fe proclama que "Jesucristo es el rostro humano de Dios y el rostro divino del hombre". Por eso "la opción preferencial por los pobres está implícita en la fe cristológica en aquel Dios que se ha hecho pobre por nosotros, para enriquecernos con su pobreza." (Aparecida 392). Jesús

siendo hijo de Dios no se vanagloria de su condición. Él tenía el poder, la potestad y la autoridad y aún así se hizo uno como nosotros. De tal manera que Jesús viene a demostrarnos con acciones y obras el verdadero sentido del amor, y la paz con los más vulnerables. Jesús nos invita a ser verdaderos hombres y mujeres comprometidos con el proyecto de Dios. Las condiciones de nuestro tiempo continúan siendo las mismas del tiempo de Jesús.

El verdadero seguidor de Jesús está llamado a seguir el modelo de Jesús. Debemos comprometernos a ser testigos fieles del mensaje de esperanza para el hombre y la mujer en nuestra sociedad. Sin embargo, el mundo nos desafía

constantemente presentándonos un modelo de vida diferente al modelo de Jesús. En nuestra realidad podemos notar gravísimos abusos a los derechos humanos y los poderosos gobernantes oprimiendo a los indefensos con el poder que el mismo pueblo les ha otorgado. En efecto, aquellos que tienen el poder deberían utilizar el poder para servir a la gente. En la primera Lectura del libro de Sabiduría encontramos un maravilloso ejemplo "Supliqué y se me concedió la prudencia; invoqué y vino sobre mí el espíritu de sabiduría." Los gobernantes de todas las naciones deberían abrazar la humildad, el amor, la paz y abrir sus corazones e implorar la prudencia y el espíritu de sabiduría para desarrollar el bienestar de la sociedad. A través de la historia podemos descubrir hechos inhumanos cometidos por aquellos que tienen el poder de gobernar. Hoy la Iglesia rebosa de alegría con la canonización de Monseñor Romero, arzobispo de El Salvador que se convierte oficialmente en Santo para la Iglesia Universal. El pueblo salvadoreño ha esperado siempre gozosamente este día lleno de alegría, aunque para muchos salvadoreños ya es un santo. Monseñor Romero fue asesinado el 24 de Marzo de 1980 por el gobierno salvadoreño mientras oficiaba una Misa en

el Hospital Divina Providencia. "Monseñor Romero comprendió que como cristiano, como obispo, no se podía callar ante las injusticias diarias que veía en su país. Y opto por los pobres de su pueblo, a quienes defendía. Desde los pobres descubrió que Dios es de ellos, es su defensor y libertador; entre los pobres descubrió que Dios es el Dios empequeñecido, culto, sufriente y crucificado. Esto le hizo ahondar también en el misterio de un Dios siempre mayo, trascendente, la última reserva de verdad, de bondad, de humildad, con que contamos los seres humanos."

Un hombre se le acerco a Jesús y le preguntó "¿Maestro que debo hacer para alcanzar la vida eterna?" Jesús le dice ya sabes los mandamientos. El hombre le dice Maestro, todo eso lo he cumplido desde joven. Jesús dijo; "Sólo una cosa te falta: Ve y vende lo que tienes, da el dinero a los pobres y así tendrás un tesoro en los cielos. Después, ven y síqueme". Pero al oír estas palabras, el hombre se entristeció y se fue apesadumbrado, porque tenía muchos bienes." Jesús nos presenta a un hombre que no fue capaz de desprenderse de sus posesiones y de ayudar a los pobres. Monseñor Romero es llamado "la voz de los sin voz" porque dio testimonio del amor al ejemplo de Cristo, derramando su

> sangre para la salvación de todos. Abrazo la opción preferencial por los pobres y se acercó, sufrió, y amo al pobre campesino que era pisoteado por el gobierno. Hermanos y hermanas, quizás no seamos ricos, pero podemos ser defensores, protectores de la justicia y defender al hombre y mujer. Quizás hemos cumplido los mandamientos, pero seguimos llevando en el corazón posesiones que no son nuestras sino del mundo: enojo, odio, rencor, avaricia, poder, envidia, y estas posesiones no dejan que nos acerquemos a la gente sencilla. Acércate a Jesús y comparte de lo que tienes con el que no tiene. No esperes nada a cambio, solo haz feliz al que lo necesita.

ST BONAVENTURE TO OFFER PROGRAM ON DIALOGUE IN OCTOBER



We now live in a world desperately in need of dialogue, but which is woefully lacking in the skill and practice of it. Dialogue is the foundation on which all that is broken in our society might be made whole. Pope Francis offers a good definition - "Dialogue is born from an attitude of respect for the other person, from a conviction that the other person has something good to say.
