### 1. Pews Are Going Fast



### 16 Pews Remaining

Our recent Pew and Chair Campaign has been a great success. The funds raised to date combined with previous gifts have allowed us to make some wonderful improvements to the interior of our church building over the last months. If you haven't been in the church, you may not realize we have replaced the flooring in the church, refinished and reupholstered the church pews and chapel chairs, repainted

and improved the lighting in the church foyer and chapel, and renovated the bathrooms.

This work has been possible because of the generous donations of our parish family members. Thank you to all who have given so far.

We want to continue the improvements. You can help. You can celebrate or remember someone close to you by dedicating a Chapel Chair or Church pew. As of this writing, we have **just 16 church pews and 54 chapel chairs** that have not been dedicated. The response has been wonderful and we don't want you to miss your opportunity.

The donation for a pew is \$2,000 and a chair is \$1,000. You can make the payment as a one-time gift or pledge over one year—paying quarterly or monthly. To complete the dedication, visit our <u>website</u> or call the parish office at (925) 672-5800.



### 1) Faith and Racial Healing

### Sacraments, Pastoral Counseling, and Staff Support

We're here for you! Our clergy and pastoral staff continue to be available to you during this pandemic. We can offer pastoral counseling by appointment, over the phone or by videocall, and **the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is available in person** when needed. Please call the parish office at (925) 672-580 to

make an appointment. We offer **the Sacrament of Reconciliation** in the classrooms on Saturdays at 2:30 pm, and during Lent we've added a second opportunity on Thursdays at 3:30 pm.

The office has had to close for walk-up visits, but staff are available by appointment. Please call the main office number or call or email the staffperson directly. As our staff are working from both the office and home, it is often easier to reach people by email. However, we are monitoring phones and voice mail, and will return messages as soon as possible.

Under current health regulations our ministries are unable to hold regular meetings at the parish. We are able to schedule outdoor gatherings for prayer and worship. Please contact your staff liaison if you are interested in scheduling a prayer gathering.
