## 1. Sunday Reflection

The season of Lent is associated with three penitential practices: prayer, fasting and almsgiving. Of the three, fasting often generates the most questions: "What *is* fasting?" "Why do we do it?" "Does God care?" "Are there risks?"

Fasting is reducing the amount of food we eat as a way of helping us lift our mind and heart to God.

Although Jesus cautioned against fasting to win honor in the eyes of others, he clearly assumed that his disciples would fast (Mt 6:16-18). I find that in the midst of a busy day, the modest pang of hunger associated with a partial fast (e.g. skipping a meal) can help me slow down a bit and remember to ask God to bless my endeavors.



### Sacraments, Pastoral Counseling, and Staff Support

We're here for you! Our clergy and pastoral staff continue to be available to you during this pandemic. We can offer pastoral counseling by appointment, over the phone or by videocall, and **the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is available in person** when needed. Please call the parish office at (925) 672-580 to make an appointment. We offer **the Sacrament of Reconciliation** in the classrooms on Saturdays at 2:30 pm, and during Lent we've added a second opportunity on Thursdays at 3:30 pm.

The office has had to close for walk-up visits, but staff are available by appointment. Please call the main office number or call or email the staffperson directly. As our staff are working from both the office and home, it is often easier to reach people by email. However, we are monitoring phones and voice mail, and will return messages as soon as possible.

Under current health regulations our ministries are unable to hold regular meetings at the parish. We are able to schedule outdoor gatherings for prayer and worship. Please contact your staff liaison if you are interested in scheduling a prayer gathering.
