Simple Family Traditions at Christmas

Each year my kids ask me to tell them the story of my favorite Christmas. I've told them the same story so many times that they can tell it themselves. "The IOU Christmas" was the first Christmas my family was a single parent household. There was no money for gifts. The turkey dinner, complete with a bowl of nuts and tangerines in the center of the table, was a huge stretch on the food budget. My brothers and sisters and I were just happy to be together with Mom. The house was full and peaceful; just being together was our gift.

We knew better than to expect the entire Sears catalog under our Christmas tree. Instead, we each quietly made things for each other. On Christmas morning our tree was redecorated with special gifts. One tag read, "I owe you one flannel shirt" and another read "I promise not to annoy you". It was so simple and so much fun. That was the Christmas I got out of doing chores for an entire week!

Christmas has become so hectic and so commercial for many people that we easily lose sight of the joy and celebration of Christ's birth. Whose birthday is it anyway? So how do we enjoy Christmas without losing sight of its meaning?

We have been trying to simplify the holidays for years. Christmas is about family and about being together. We always tell our extended family to take it easy on the gift giving or, better yet, arrive with none at all. Their presence is the best present! That's the tradition we're trying to teach our kids.

The truth is that most of us need the hardest gift to give: time. Just like the IOU Christmas, each year I wish for the same thing. I want time with all of my family, time to enjoy them, time to appreciate them, time to catch my breath and realize that my healthy children are the greatest gift of all.

There are so many simple traditions we as a family look forward to each Christmas season: baking, stringing popcorn, driving around to look at the twinkling lights and singing holiday songs from Thanksgiving until New Year's Day. We start the weekend after Thanksgiving by hauling boxes of decorations from the attic. Without rushing anywhere, we spend an entire day together, talking, singing, playing, decorating and just being a family.

We also have another tradition, being involved with the Human Concerns Outreach Ministry. We pick names from the Giving Tree and take backpacks for the homeless. The time we spend shopping with our children is time well spent. We try and teach them the importance of giving and helping others who may be having their own "IOU Christmas". In this giving we receive much, much more; such simple traditions are worth passing on.

December 17, 2017 - Third Sunday of Advent

First Reading: Isaiah 61:1-2a, 10-11

Isaiah describes the joy and salvation which will accompany the coming of Christ. He compares the plants which spring from a garden to the justice that will spring from all nations.

Second Reading: 1 Thessalonians 5:16-24

Paul reminds the Thessalonians to constantly ready themselves for Christ's arrival. He tells them to "avoid any semblance of evil" so that they may be found irreproachable when Jesus does arrive.

Gospel: John 1:6-8, 19-28

John explains that he is only a messenger to the people for one more powerful than himself. John stresses to them that they must make a path for the one so powerful that he is not fit to unfasten the strap of his sandal.








Dear Parents.
