## **Confirmation 2018**

"You yourselves are our letter, written on our hearts, to be known and read by all; and you show that you are a letter of Christ, prepared by us, written not with ink but with the Spirit of the living God." ~ 2 Corinthians 3:2

Congratulations and God bless all of our newly confirmed teens! Confirmation is about finding your own path and shaping your own spirituality. It's about deepening your relationship with God, Jesus, and the Holy Spirit and how to incorporate this belief into your everyday life. It's about faith, hope, love and courage.

It is my hope now that you are confirmed you will find the path that is right for you. Here's some advice; gravity helps. Gravity is that tug that keeps your feet on the ground. Gravity is committing to the possibility of opening up your mind and heart and allowing the Holy Spirit to assist you along the way towards building a stronger relationship with God. Sometimes that pull is so great and when the fit is right, the commitment becomes a lifestyle.

Commitment does have its repercussions not only for you but also for the way you relate to others. The truth is that living this way will ask more of you than you can imagine. But, here is the key... "Give and it will be given to you."

We are all challenged by, but graced to experience the seed falling to the ground, sometimes on rocky soil, sometimes on less than fertile soil, but when it lands in the right conditions, it grows into the most wonderful fruit and it all begins with Baptism.

The Spirit you were given in Baptism is sealed and strengthened in Confirmation. The Spirit's fruits are identifiable: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness generosity, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control. How can you develop the fruits of the Spirit in the moments of your lives? The gift of the Spirit is God's love creating, animating, and bonding us together. It is God's very life toward us, for us, with us, and within us. Our call is to participate in all creating, animating, bonding, and uniting expressions of His perfect and divine love so that we become His signs of reconciliation and peace. This is how God is seen and touched and heard.

We are grounded in ministry each with its own activities and areas of responsibilities. We are all incorporated into the body of Christ and each of us is given an equal share in the mission of God's Word and Spirit. It is up to you to accept your Baptismal responsibility and understand that ministry is rooted in God, Jesus, and the Holy Spirit and calls for living your life understanding yourselves as being part of God's family, not set apart from them. The gift of the Holy Spirit, God living in us, gives us again and again the faith, the gravity to walk the path moving among all the road blocks that will come your way. It is hope that will help you and love that will keep you going – knowing that you share in the gift of God's life here and now. Do you have the courage it takes?

May you come to know God's love and the peace His love can bring you. May Jesus bring you hope and may the Holy Spirit continue to strengthen your faith every day of your lives.

**Sacrament of Reconciliation** ~ The Sacrament of Reconciliation is celebrated individually every Saturday afternoon at 4pm or by individual appointment with Father Mike at any time.

**Baptisms** ~ Parents are urged to begin preparation for this sacrament three months prior to delivery. The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated every Sunday at 12:45pm. You will be invited to attend a Pre-Baptismal session either before or after the birth of your child.

**Christian Marriage** ~ The couple should contact the office one year before the desired date for the marriage to insure proper preparation for this Sacrament.

**Ministry to the Sick** ~ If anyone among you is physically handicapped, aged, hospitalized, sick or shut in, please call the office so that we can be attentive to those who are in need.

**Hospital Visitation** ~ Please notify the Parish office when a member of the family is in the hospital due to illness.

Confirmation, First Eucharist & Reconciliation ~ Though immediate preparation is given to all before receiving these sacraments, candidates are expected to receive a Christian upbringing in their family life through formal religious education classes and at Sunday worship in the years prior to receiving these sacraments.



# June 10, 2018 - 10th Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading: Genesis 3:9-15

God asked Adam why he ate the fruit from the forbidden tree. Adam blames his companion, who in turn blames a serpent. God then told the serpent it would be banned from other animals, and be an enemy of humanity.

#### Second Reading: II Corinthians 4:13-5:1

Paul describes our belief that "He who raised up the Lord Jesus will raise us up along with Jesus." Although our bodies grow weaker, each day our inner strength grows. Paul also describes our burdens as light when compared to the eternal rewards we can attain.

#### **Gospel:** *Mark 3:20-35*

Some of the scribes felt that Jesus was possessed and claimed that he expelled demons with help from Satan. Jesus silenced them by asking, "How can Satan expel Satan?" Jesus also warned them that although many sins would be forgiven, blasphemy against the Holy Spirit would not. Jesus was then told that his mother, brother and sisters were asking for him. He asked, "Who are my mother and brother and sisters? Whoever does the will of God is brother and sister and mother to me." This demonstrates Jesus' deep love for all those who love God.
