Sacrament of Reconciliation ~ The Sacrament of Reconciliation is celebrated every Saturday afternoon between 4:00pm - 4:45pm or by individual appointment with Fr. Owen or Fr. Alex at any time.

Baptisms ~ Parents are urged to begin preparation for this sacrament three months prior to delivery. The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated every Sunday at 12:45pm, during weekend masses or by appointment. Couples are invited to attend a Pre-Baptismal session either before or after the birth of their first child.

Marriage ~ We welcome all couples preparing for the Sacrament of Marriage. Please contact the office one year before the desired wedding date to insure proper preparation.




