

REFLECTION FOR THE WEEK



3rd Sunday of Lent—Mar., 7, 2021—Lent is the Time to Ask God for What You Need

He was waiting for warmer weather. He was waiting for the days to get longer. He was waiting for his mother's permission. Finally, his mother told the eager five-year-old that it was A Holy Lent time. He put on his jacket and went out to the side yard. This would be his very special garden.

This would be his very own place in the world. He sat right down in the middle of the dirt and began clearing the weeds. He wanted this little piece of ground to be perfect.

Soon his little fingers came upon a hard object right in the middle of his planting place. He moved the earth around it. He found a huge root that was anchored like cement. The little boy pulled with all his might. He dug deeper hoping he could loosen the root from underneath. The root did not budge.

His mother watched him from the kitchen window. She was proud of his excitement and commitment. She saw his determination and his willingness to try a variety of options. She could also sense his frustration. She went out to the yard and her little one explained the situation. "Why didn't you use all your strength?" she asked. He son looked hurt and patiently explained he had used all his strength.

"No," said his mother, "You did not use all the strength you had. You didn't ask me."

Together, the little boy and his mother pulled out the heavy root and prepared the ground for planting.

Lent means "springtime" and we are asked to prepare our hearts for Resurrection days. But what stands in our way? How many times have we said, "This is just too difficult. I've tried so many options and I am ready to give up."

These Lenten days give us the opportunity to evaluate all of our resources. God is available for help. God offers the strength we need. We aren't expected to plant the seeds of Easter joy alone. When times are tough, God says to us, "You haven't used all your strength. You haven't asked Me." Perhaps today a new conversation is in order?


