Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

This Sunday we are celebrating the fullness of joy with God's gift of the Holy Spirit.

We will also celebrate Fr. Joseph's 25th Priestly Anniversary. Fr. Joseph came here to our parish on February 2013. He is originally from Loikaw diocese in Myanmar (Burma). He is the oldest son and has three sisters. His priestly ordination day was on April 14, 1993. He served both as associate pastor for his first 3 years of his priesthood and as pastor for 16 years in Myanmar. He has a great zeal and love for everyone especially for our Karenni and Karen brothers and sisters. He visits weekly with the Karenni and Karen people in their apartments or house for prayer. He does this every Wednesday with our Interns Students and on most Saturday mornings do house prayers. Twice a month he says mass at St. Casmir parish in Burmese for the Karen community. Two weeks ago he was able to go for the first time to Europe with our youth of the NeoCatechumenal communities. Although he had some difficulties with the European visa he managed to be there with them.



This Sunday I invite everyone to the Grade School Gym after the 10:30am mass to celebrate with Fr. Joseph. There will be food and drinks for everyone.

I am very happy to have Fr. Joseph as a great priestly example for me.

Missionary Speaker at St. Bernard's on June 2-3

Fr. Richard Nguta of the Diocese of Kitui, Kenya, will be celebrating the Masses at St. Bernard's on the week-end of June 2-3. Kitui lies in a semi-arid region where peasants struggle to survive on subsistence agriculture, and health is challenged by malaria, HIV/AIDS and intestinal worms. In the face of this immense struggle, the Catholic Church in Kitui is a tremendous source of life and hope, and has grown from a few hundred to more than 300,000 Catholics in just 50 years!

In 2004, our archdiocese began a partnership with the Kitui Diocese to deepen our bonds to the African Church. Through this partnership, many in our archdiocese have been inspired and touched by the warmth, joy and vibrant Catholic faith of our sisters and brothers in Kenya.

There will be a second collection to support the emerging Catholic Church in Kitui that is such a beacon of hope to the people. Please extend a warm welcome to Fr. Richard and please be as generous as possible. Thank you.
