#### Ron's Retirement

Our maintenance manager Ron Gates will be retiring from his job after 36 years of great service to our parish. We will be losing a great person with wonderful skills. All these years he kept all our buildings maintained very well with all their challenges. The last and biggest projects he worked on were the Bell Towers and the Church Roof. He also was here when there was the project of the High School Gym link, the renovation of the church and numerous other works that I am not aware of. He always was ready and available for any type of situation like on snow days together with Jenaro they made sure that our side walks were clean. Even on emergency calls, two Easters ago on Holy Saturday we had a water leak in the water heater of the Rectory and they managed to change the water heater on that same day.

Our campus requires two full time maintenance workers to keep up with all the repairs and up keeping of our buildings. The most important part of the work is the running of the boilers, we have two large furnaces that heat most of the buildings, including the Church, the schools buildings, office, rectory and High School building. This time of the year is when the city inspectors come to check them and see if we are good to go for another winter.
