Dear Brothers and Sisters,

#### Projects Approved by our Finance Council

Grade School Brick work: As many of you know, the Grade School building brick desperately needs a tuck pointing. Our maintenance team has been looking into this to determine the most economical way we can do this work. They reached out to various local tuck pointing companies. They found a construction company called Quality Restoration. The price of this work will be as follows: \$38K for the tuck pointing and all brick and mortar material, approximately \$10-15K for the high-lift renting, and approximately \$20K for the sheet metal capstone.


Boiler #1 leak Repair. Last winter we had Boiler #2 repaired from the same cause. We have to do the same repair to the other boiler (boiler #1). The cost of this repair is about \$25,000. This work is being done in this two weeks ago.

Office Phone System: This past week we have switched our phone company from Allstream to Popp Communications. This change will save us some money. Allstream were charging us around \$800 a month while Popp Communication new contract will be \$375 a month which includes also the three elevators of our schools building. The elevators were connected with Century Link and were charging us \$130 a month for the emergency lines. Now with Popp Communications the price of these lines will be only \$20 per elevator.

Our Finance Council is closely monitoring our cash projection and planning accordingly all these projects for the good of our buildings. Also the council has worked on a budget for this new fiscal year.

#### St. Lawrence Deacon and Martyr

St. Lawrence served as a deacon in Rome in the third century. He was a disciple of <u>Pope Sixtus II</u> (251-258). The Pope chose him as one of seven deacons to serve in Rome. He eventually became an archdeacon. As archdeacon of Rome he served at the altar with the Pope and was his assistant serving the poor.

During the reign of <u>Emperor Valerian</u> in 258 he was arrested. While in prison it is believed that St. Lawrence cured a blind man named Lucillus and several other blind people. Because he refused to cooperate with his captors he was martyred. He was roasted alive on a gridiron. St. Lawrence died joyfully proclaiming his faith. He prayed for the conversion of the city of Rome and the world.

Before his death St. Lawrence remarked; "At last I am finished; you may now take from me and eat!" He then turned to God in prayer saying, "I thank You, O Lord; that I am permitted to enter Your portals.



## WORSHIP & MEDITATION



Be still and know that I am God. Silence is sacred. Silence speaks the language of the soul and is the foundation of all life and eternity itself. Silence takes us beyond the limits of our minds and allows us to seek and to love the essence of all love, perfect love, and being. In silence, we can be non-verbally present to things and to God in ways that words cannot accomplish. We can discover, encounter, and be present to truths that our minds struggle to conceive and then set aside the boxes we put around things when comprehending them is challenging. We can know the unknowable and touch eternity when we encounter the core silence in our souls.

We can do this even on a noisy street and in the midst of the greatest distraction. Once we have made friends with silence, the rambling noise of the world no longer seems to matter, and we can carry a deep forgiving peace within us, even when physical silence cannot be found. We know that we are loved, cared for, sustained, nourished, embraced, and carried. There is nothing to fear in silence, and I can be present to myself in the same way that God is present to me. I can see myself as God sees me. All of my faults, weaknesses, imperfections, failings, and sinfulness melt away in the abundance of God's mercy. All of the worldly things we see as being important no longer are.

It is in silence that all of the barriers that divide us disappear. There is no more "yours" and "mine" but only the oneness of "ours." There is no longer a need to "figure things out," and we tap into our desire to simply let things be. Silence is creative and powerful and gives us hope. Silence is God's greatest blessing. God became one with humanity in silence. It allows us to be one with all of creation, with the moon and the stars and all of the creatures God has made. The smallest particle of creation radiates with beauty. Silence allows us to soar beyond ourselves and connect in ways that the mind can only imagine. When all is quiet, we begin to see that it is only our fear that keeps us from the Lord. It is our fear that causes us to sink and to fail. We can hear the gentle whisper that tells us to reach for God's hand. We discover that we yearn for the salvation and wholeness that only God can give to us. Be still my soul and be at peace.
