

Dear brothers and sisters,

Last Saturday the 1st community of the Neocatechumenal Way in our parish did the rite of Traditio, which is the rite of handing over the Apostle creed and sending of the 2by2 to announce the Good News to neighboring homes of our parish. More than 70 brothers and sisters came from Boston and Miami and transmitted the Creed to them. In spite of the hurricane and heavy rain, the brothers and sisters from Miami came, which was the great sign of faith and love manifested in our parish.

Friday was beautiful appreciation dinner and almost 200 people attended. Communion among all those who were there with St. Agnes parish being present was such an amazing thing. I want to thank all those who made it possible. Men's club cooked tasteful spaghetti meatball pasta and others from pastoral council and Neocatechumenal communities served and the Spanish community did all the clean up work. This is a sign of unity among us and I am grateful for everything and to everyone. May God continue to bless all of us.

This week's liturgy is based on a single disease which existed many years ago. Naaman was a Syrian army commander and didn't think the advice for a cure was very complimentary to him or his country. "Aren't there more beautiful rivers in Syria than the Jordan; why should I go into it seven times?" Yet when he does he is miraculously cured of his leprosy and we hear his grateful prayer.

On his final journey to Jerusalem, Jesus was passing between Samaria and Galilee. Entering a village there he was met by ten lepers. They stood at a distance from Jesus and his followers. Among this group of lepers there was a Samaritan, although Jews and Samaritans normally avoided one another. They all lifted up their voices in a petition that must have moved the heart of Jesus. They threw themselves at God's mercy. Jesus took pity on them and told to go and show themselves to the local priests. The Law said that such cures had to be verified in this way. The lepers obeyed Jesus Christ and went on their way, as if they had already been healed. As a result of their faith and docility, they were cleansed of their illness.

But only one leper returned, the Samaritan. He had a grateful heart and so should we. Let us be grateful for everything God has given to us in each and everyone of our lives. God always blesses the thankful hearts and gives more and more. So if we want to receive then give.
