



COVERING OF CROSSES

The Church says that from the 5th Sunday of Lent until Good Friday the crosses may be covered in purple. Why do we do this? To remind us of the weeks before the Passion when Christ no longer walked openly among the people, but hid himself. There is a papal chapel where this custom was lived that had the words of the Gospel in Latin inscribed:

"Jesus autem abscondebat se." Jesus hid himself.

Another reason given is that Christ's divinity was hidden at the time of his suffering and death. The images of the saints can be covered since it would seem improper for the servants to appear when the Master himself is hidden.



Palm Sunday is here with us, we hear today of the suffering servant of Isaiah written many centuries before Jesus Christ came and yet speaking prophetically of him and his passion

that we enter today. Even though Jesus Christ was disfigured and broken he knew he would not be put to shame. He came as the true Lamb, led to the slaughter before his shearers and he opened not his mouth. He offered not a word to those who accused him of false charges and he took on the sins of the whole world, yours and mine. This is the true Lamb of God, as his cousin John the Baptist called him. Jesus is the Lamb that saves us from all kinds of death, especially the death of sin, fear and anxiety.

So let us use today and this Holy Week to enter into the passion and death of Jesus Christ once again this year. This is the only thing that can help us to make sense of our life. The Fridays of Lent have hopefully prepared us for this, and even if we did not use Lent well this year it is not too late. He comes to take away all of our sins and bring us to a place of peace and reconciliation. Jesus is not fooled by the waving of the palms; he knows what awaits him in just a few days.

Let us ask the Lord to help us enter into our cross, into the thing in our life that we cannot accept, and there is where we will find life, a life that never ends. Let us not complain and grumble about what faces us today. Ask the Lord to have the grace to accept our situation in life: priest, married, single, divorced, alone. When we see that this is God's will for us we will find joy. The difficulties remain but somehow they no longer matter, when we have Jesus Christ.

Please join us for the Triduum—these three days starting with Holy Thursday, then Good Friday and culminating in the Easter Vigil, which is the mother of all vigils and was meant to last until the break of dawn. Tuesday at 6:30 PM will be a Penance Service which will help us to enter the greatest weekend of the liturgical year. In this Easter we have the chance to relive the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. Give this the first place in your Easter plans.
