The wonderful crowds on Palm Sunday, and the spring weather, I hope

gave rise to many new people joining us during the Holy Triduum of Easter. The Church also wants us to recover the all night vigil that was present in the primitive Church from the very beginning, which we had here again. The sign of this all night vigil for families and everyone makes present in a tangible way the resurrection of Jesus Christ, and makes us partakers of it.

The women in all the Gospels are the first to see the evidence of the Resurrection. They experienced a violent earthquake and an angel of the Lord was present. The guards were completely shaken up, as we cannot imagine. And the angel comforted the woman and told them to go ahead to Galilee, and they will see Him! Let us go to Galilee, which is the middle of the world, this area, a stone's throw from New York City, and there we will find Jesus Christ! We do not have to go very far to find the Lord. He is very close to us these days of Easter and wants us to experience the Resurrection.

I would invite you to continue or to start attending daily Mass as a practical way to pray and to rejoice in this Season of Easter, which lasts for fifty days. During this time you are able to celebrate this life changing event: Christ died for us and rose again. He has overcome death, all kinds of death that we also experience every day. We have no reason to be afraid. Jesus Christ is the only one who solves the riddle of death, and so we can rejoice.

This Easter is very different from last year's and can be a special time for all of us! Let us ask the Lord to help us to be his disciples in a more concrete way, and to have a personal know-how of this Passover mystery, where we can experience new life today!

Let us pray for those who are sick and those who are serving them during these holy season of Easter. Christ is Risen, and will rise again for all of us in a special way this year.

DIVINE MERCY CELEBRATION

Next Sunday, April 16, is Divine Mercy Sunday. St Faustina heard these words from the Lord (Diary 699) "I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners... The soul that will go to Confession [within 8 days] and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. On that day all the divine floodgates through which graces flow are opened..." Pope St. John Paul II established this universal feast in April 2000.

Easter Sunday and the Easter Octave

He is Risen! It's time for egg hunts, Easter baskets, and all the other Easter fun. Easter hymns are glorious and joyful. Sing some of them together with your family. You might even want to learn a new one each day of Easter week. Choose a time each day during the week of Easter to light a candle and pray together, thanking God for His Passion and Resurrection, by which He made it possible for us to gain eternal life.

EASTER SUNDAY

The resurrection of Christ is the basis of our Christian Faith. The Resurrection is the greatest of the miracles -- it proves that Jesus is God. That is why St. Paul writes:

"If Christ has not been raised, then our preaching is in vain; and your Faith is in vain... And if Christ has not been raised, then your Faith is a delusion and you are still lost in your sins... But in fact, Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have fallen asleep."

If Jesus Christ did not rise from the dead, then the Church is a fraud, and Faith is a sham. But if He really did rise from the dead, His message is true! Without the Resurrection, Jesus would have remained forever a good person who had met a tragic end. People would remember some of his teachings, and a handful of people might try to live according to them. All the basic doctrines of Christianity are founded on the truth of the Resurrection. "Jesus is Lord; He is risen" was the central theme of the kerygma (or preaching), of the Apostles.
