Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Hopefully we are starting to see that it is not easy to change, to think as a Christian and to be on God's grace and His plan. I hope we are all being challenged to direct our thoughts to whatever is true, honorable, just, pure, lovely and gracious,

as St. Paul said a couple of weeks ago. It is worthwhile to think about these things and not just what enters into our heads.

We were reminded last week that you and I are made in the image and likeness of God and that image needs to be uncovered, awakened, polished. By making an examination of conscience each day we can be more proactive in seeing what type of food are we letting into our heads, and maybe some of it or a lot of it ought to change.

This week we are going to look at a few tell tale signs that we are growing as friends and followers of Jesus Christ, and see if we on getting on God's way of life. Jesus is asked by the Pharisees about which law is the greatest? Of course they are asking this in order to take a shot at him. The Jews at this time, and even today, endlessly debate and discuss the 613 specific commandments of the Law, so to ask which one was greatest suggests a simplification that was never considered before. Jesus answers brilliantly again, without hesitation: "You shall love the Lord, your God, will all your heart, will all your soul, and with all your mind... and you shall love your neighbor as yourself (Mt 22. 37-39)."

The first commandment which is from Deuteronomy is very famous and said daily by the Jews, but the second commandment is more obscure and even sparked controversy, and was rejected by some Pharisees as no law at all: you shall love your neighbor as yourself. What Jesus did was inconceivable to a Jew. And not only did he put them together but he said all the other laws hung on these two.

When Jesus puts these two commandments together he is not just giving us a higher hurdle to overcome but he is showing us the way to happiness. If we truly seek God and love him first above all things, only then can we truly love our neighbor. If our heart is not purified first from loving God then it is all the more difficult to love the one next to us. When we make time for God then patience, charity, avoiding judgments more easily follow. They are gifts that God will give you as you deepen your relationship with him. This is the way we are wired; our hearts are made for loving God and through him to love others. Let us continue to redirect our thinking to thoughts that are gracious, pure, lovely.
