Dear brothers and sisters,

Pope Francis' recent letter about using the Christmas manger well for family and ourselves. It is a wonderful teaching experience for parents, grandparents and children and this tradition which is very much being

lost today can be recovered. Of course, the first place is in the home, but look for other opportunities to set one up in the office or outdoor mangers in our towns, etc. It is a great reminder of how Christ humbled himself to be one like us.

Jesus will baptize with the Holy Spirit and with fire. The Scriptures uses fire in two senses: one of them is the cleansing or purifying action of fire and the second is fire as a punishment. The first aspect can help us a bit today if we think of our life here and especially of our difficulties as part of God's plan to purify us. We have been chosen to enter in the furnace of humiliation, or of sickness, or old age, and this cleansing that will get us ready to enter the kingdom of heaven.

This cleansing or what the Church calls purgatory does not affect the saints who go directly to heaven. I too can choose to be purified of my sins, my bad habits, while I am still on earth. How I react to the trails and difficulties of each day has something to do with the judgment that God will make of me at the end of my life. Advent comes to help me, and you, to prepare for that coming of the Lord. My whole life is a preparation for that meeting. I need to be ready for it, and to look forward to it, not to be afraid of it or think this is nonsense.

What do we expect to see when Jesus Christ comes to meet us at the moment of death? Maybe even John was surprised when he saw Jesus who was full of love and mercy, even for the greatest of sinners. Let us rejoice that God loves us and wants us to be happy even here in this life. He respects us and our choices and never forces himself upon us. He is waiting for an invitation from us and he is very patient, much more patient than us, thankfully. I invite you all to find some time to take advantage of the sacrament of reconciliation this weekend after and before all the masses and during this time of Advent. So that we may worthy to celebrate the birth of our Lord Jesus Christ. God is calling you today. Fr. Doss
