Dear Brothers and Sisters:

When the Scribes and Pharisees confronted Jesus with the decision about stoning the woman who was caught in adultery he was put in a very difficult spot.

If he condemned her he would lose forever his reputation for mercy and love, and would never be called a friend of sinners. Also, he would immediately be in trouble with the Roman authorities since the Jews had no power to carry out the death sentence. On the other hand, if Jesus pardoned her it could be said that he was condoning adultery, and breaking the law of Moses. This was the trap that they sought to use. As usual, Jesus employed it in such a way that it fell back against them.

At first Jesus stooped down and wrote with his finger in the sand. What did he write? According to one Armenian manuscript Jesus was writing down the sins of the accusers in the sand. If this is true, he was confronting the self-confident leaders with their own sins. And then Jesus said, "Let the man without sin be the first to cast a stone." The word that Jesus used means not only without sin, but even without a sinful desire. He was saying, "You may stone her but only if you never wanted to do the same thing yourself." There was a silence—and then they slowly drifted away, one at a time.

Jesus and the woman were left alone and he said to her, "Has no one condemned you? Then neither will I; go and sin no more." The Lord says the same to us. It is a solemn time to take a good look at ourselves and our innermost desires, and to ask God for his mercy in the Sacrament of Penance. We will have a longer time for Penance on Tuesday, April 15th from 6:30 to 8:30 PM. Come and celebrate God's forgiveness. Let us as one family of faith of St. Bernard parish prepare ourselves by confessing our sins and receiving the forgiveness, will get ready to celebrate the Holy Triduum. May God bless you all.

COVERING OF CROSSES

The Church says that from the 5th Sunday of Lent until Good Friday the crosses may be covered in purple. Why do we do this? To remind us of the weeks before the Passion when Christ no longer walked openly among the people, but hid himself. There is a papal chapel where this custom was lived that had the words of the Gospel in Latin inscribed: "Jesus autem abscondebat se." Jesus hid himself. Another reason given is that Christ's divinity was hidden at the time of his suffering and death.
