#### REMEMBER ST. BERNARD'S IN YOUR WILL

Do you have a will? A wonderful way to help our parish and to save taxes is to remember St. Bernard's in your will. There is still plenty of work to be done in our church and also in the other buildings.



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Jesus tells us that he comes to cast fire on the earth and he desires to be baptized, which meant a total immersion in his sufferings and death. Somehow we make Jesus into a sweet man who never spoke a harsh

word but this gospel shows us something different. And it can help us to reflect about the judgment that each one of us will face at the end of our lives, as we heard last week. Fire many times in the Scriptures can refer to the Holy Spirit or a fire that will purify our hearts and make us clean.

The Greek work *baptizein* means to dip, to be submerged or immersed. It can be used to speak of a boat that is sunk or a man that is dead drunk or a scholar that is sunk by his examiner's questions. In general it means that a person is overwhelmed by some grim and terrible experience. Jesus uses the word in this way.

He knows there is a terrible experience that he has to pass through and he will not be distracted from it. The movement in Luke's gospel is always aimed at Jerusalem, at Calvary; his immersion in his suffering and death. It is the culmination of his life and of his desire to do the will of the Father.

Somehow we might tend to think that suffering is going to kill us and overwhelm us and, therefore, we avoid it. For all of us there will always be suffering in life, and not everyone reacts the same.

In the second reading St. Paul tells us to fix our eyes on Jesus because He is the leader and perfector of our faith. There is a greater joy waits for us who endures the suffering and cross of our lives that God permits to purify us. This is also our baptism in the Lord. The division between faith and reason always a struggle in the families. Today's generation believe in the reason not faith, which we see clearly with the attendance of our youth in the Sunday liturgy. They don't want to come to church because it is boring but when the suffering appears in their life they wonder why. Peace will come to us as a result of embracing our cross, not from running away from it. Let us ask God for the courage to die a little to ourselves each day and face the sufferings in our life with courage.

#### **Prayer Shawl Ministry**

Did you know that we have a prayer shawl group at St. Bernard's? This fall we are celebrating our 20th year of making and praying over shawls and lap blankets that are given to someone experiencing a serious illness or living through a difficult time in their lives. While we make an item we pray for the receiver, and pray that the item will provide protection, strength, healing and patience. Other prayers are directed to the doctors, nurses and technicians, and families and friends of the person who will be receiving the crafted item.

The group meets once a month at a parishioner's home. We share crafting tips and ideas, give instruction where we can, and socialize. We work on our items during the month and during the monthly meeting. There is no requirement for the number of items that one completes. We purchase our own materials and donate the finished items to either St. Bernard's, to the HealthEast Woodwinds Campus in Woodbury or to Our Lady of Peace Hospice in St. Paul. Sometimes we take on special projects like "chemo caps" and caps for newborns via a program that is working to reduce infant mortality by hypothermia in underdeveloped countries. We've also made themed baby hats for a fundraiser for a Pro-life group and made scarves for the Winter Special Olympics.

All prayer items are blessed by our priests before they are given to someone in need of comfort. If you know of someone in need of a prayer shawl or blanket, please contact the Parish Office. The receiver does not need to be a member of the parish.
