REMEMBER ST. BERNARD'S IN YOUR WILL

Do you have a will? A wonderful way to help our parish and to save taxes is to remember St. Bernard's in your will. There is still plenty of work to be done in our church and also in the other buildings.



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

The readings this week remind us of the importance of persevering in prayer and not losing heart. The parable in the gospel points out to us to pray always and not give up. In the Christian life there are some actions

that are performed only once, like the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Orders. Other actions are repeated many times, such as forgiveness, understanding, and cheerfulness. They are actions which we need to repeat often, even in a given day. Among these repeated actions which are for the good of our soul is the need to pray. St. Augustine commenting on this gospel said, "When faith weakens our prayer withers." Faith is the fountain of prayer and a river cannot flow if its source is dried up. We can also say when we don't pray our faith withers. Our prayer needs to be continuous and trusting, like the prayer of Jesus Christ.

The first reading from the book of Exodus presents the Jews in battle with the Amalekites. Moses' prayer is heard by God as long as he keeps his arms raised. When he lowered his arms Israel started to lose. To keep praying Aaron and Hur supported Moses' arms, one on each side. They were thus able to keep Moses praying until sunset. What does this mean for me? That we cannot grow weary of prayer and we need to ask our friends to help us since on our own it is impossible. Jesus Christ wants to help us, but he also wants to see that we want to be helped. How often we complain to ourselves and to one another, and yet we don't ask God seriously for the things we need or we get tired after asking twice?

Let us resolve to pray as Moses did: with perseverance that nothing can shake, and at times with the help of our friends. A great deal depends on this. Did you try the prayer of the eyes, heart and hands? I found it very helpful and practical. We can also use this method to imagine what God wants us to do in our parish and in our ministries, that they ought to be a real community where people know one another and help one another. Best way we can learn and experience is to use the tool God gives us this time of the year, which is to come and listen to the catechesis we are beginning and will continue every Wednesdays and Sunday at 7 PM.
