## From The Pastor's Desk

**Pentecost:** This weekend, we celebrate the Feast of Pentecost, the 50<sup>th</sup> day of Easter. It is important to note that this is an Easter Feast. Most scholars would agree that the Resurrection, Ascension and the gift / sending of the Holy Spirit took place on the same day, in the same time frame. This feast also ends the Easter Season. The Church is wise in letting us know that a celebration has a beginning and an end. This feast celebrates the ending of our most important season. It helps us to be aware that the gift of the Holy Spirit completes the work of our redemption. We continue to live in the age of the Holy Spirit. One sign that the season ends with this feast is the removal of the Paschal Candle from its place of honor near the ambo. Now it is to be placed near the baptistery. The Easter Water, Holy Water, can be put in the ordinary place. Hopefully, all have been renewed by this special Easter Season!

**Readings:** This is one of the few Feasts that has a Vigil. Christmas and Easter also have a Vigil.

**Vigil:** We have the story of the tower of Babel, which helped to explain the different languages and the difficulty it presents. The response is wonderful for Pentecost: "Lord, send out your Spirit, and renew the face of the earth." Paul knows that our hearts are restless, but the Spirit even intercedes on our behalf!

The Gospel assures us of the gift of the Spirit.

**Sunday:** In Acts we have the reversal of Babel: "Yet each of us hears them speaking in his own tongue..." The response is the same as above. Paul teaches that the Spirit is for unity and strength even though there are different gifts. Again, Pentecost has one of the four remaining Sequences in the liturgical calendar.

**In the Gospel,** Jesus gives the Apostles the gift of the Holy Spirit. God breathed over the waste and void in one of the stories of creation in Genesis and now over the fearful and locked disciples. The symbol would not have been missed by the disciples.
