## Mary our Mother \*\*\* Mary our Model

Over the past few days many of us have enjoyed a wonderful Parish Mission drawing our hearts and minds back to the importance of Blessed Virgin Mary to the fullness of the Catholic Faith. Fr. Tom Blau, OP from St. Patrick Church, Columbus gave a lively presentation of Catholic beliefs, their Scripture bases and the implications for our faith and life. People who heard Fr. Tom were impressed. Even though he had us out by 8:00 p.m. as he'd promised, many said, "I wish he'd just kept on talking ...he was so good!!"

Jesus deliberately established Mary as the spiritual mother of our redemption. This was so important that he perfected the adoption in the final act before his death on the Cross. "Behold you Mother ... behold your children." Just as family mothers pay attention to the needs of their children, so it is with our Blessed Mother Mary. Through her intercessions our needs are always in active conversation with Jesus. By her motherly care we receive Graces for the challenges and opportunities of our lives.

We're surrounded by many "role models" ... some good, some harmful. Mary as our life-model is *unique*. Submission and obedience are not often viewed as admirable qualities of a role model. We usually prefer to see assertiveness and cleverness as the preferred virtues. Yet, in Mary we see docility and willingness to fulfill the role God has given her. With her humble "Be it done unto me..." the world is changed and the door opened for the defeat of sin. Humility is her strength. Example is her leadership. Divine love and grace radiate from Mary and we honor her as our Mother and as our Model.

<u>Bishop's Annual Appeal.</u> The 2017 Bishop's Annual Appeal is underway ... the once-a-year drive throughout the Diocese to raise money to fund many vital local needs. In early May I sent a pastoral letter to every St. Mary parishioner asking for your extra-effort support for this year's campaign. I stressed that the key to improving our parish response is greater participation. About 72% of our parish population did not give to the BAA last year.

This Sunday you'll hear more BAA appeal during Mass. After my brief reflections on the Scripture readings, Phil Feldmeier will outline the needs for the Diocese to raise this money. I will conclude with another emphasis on *full participation* ... and a great idea on how we can surpass our BAA goal **AND** gather funds for two crucial St. Mary projects: building access improvement and parking lot repair.

Next weekend, there will be a second collection for the Catholic Communication Campaign (CCC). The CCC helps spread the Good News to you – and focuses on new and existing ways to communicate Jesus' Gospel message, making it available to both the faithful and those seeking faith. The CCC supports both national and diocesan communication efforts that provide news, discussions and special events and programs. Please be generous in the collection and support this important work!
