





The feast day of Pope Saint John Paul II is this Monday, October 11th.






- 1. He was the 3rd longest sitting Pope with a tenure of 26 years.



This reporting service is operated by Convercent, Inc., an independent, third-party entity that provides intake services to private institutions for reports of sensitive topics such as sexual harassment through a secure, confidential and professional platform.
