SAFE ENVIRONMENT WORKSHOP

The Archdiocese of Winnipeg strives to foster safe environments in which church activities unfold. Policies and protocols are directed toward the protection of children and youth and vulnerable adults in parishes across the archdiocese. Fostering safe environments also protects those whose ministries bring them into contact with the vulnerable. To bring such participants into contact with existing archdiocesan policies and protocols Safe Environment Workshops are being held at various locations around the Archdiocese.

Catechists, catechist assistants, parish staff and anyone involved in any ministry to the vulnerable sector (e.g. youth ministers, communion ministers, hospital visitors, etc.) are required to participate one of these workshops on a yearly basis.

A workshop will be held here in Saint John XXIII Parish Hall on **Saturday, November 3, 2018 from 10:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m.** Please advise Sharon Camier, Parish Pastoral Assistant and Safe Environment Coordinator, if you will be attending this workshop as this information needs to be forwarded to the Archdiocese.

Reminder: Those who are not able to participate in the workshop being held in our parish on November 3rd should make arrangements as soon as possible to attend another workshop being held in the Archdiocese.

PARISH CATECHISM CLASSES 2018 – 2019

Catechism classes are held on Sunday mornings at 10:15 a.m. Those who would like their children to take part in catechism classes are asked to complete a REGISTRATION FORM for each child. A catechism registration fee will help defray some of the costs of running our program. Nevertheless, this requested fee should in no way be considered a reason to refrain from enrolling children for whose parents the fee would impose an undue hardship.

As a rule, each Sunday children participating in our parish catechism program gather in the parish hall with their parents/guardians by 10:15 a.m. for some initial prayers and announcements. Then children break into their various catechetical groups and proceed with their catechists to their designated classrooms. Parents/guardians are asked to return to the parish hall by 11:15 a.m. to be ready to pick up their children.



Archdiocese of Winnipeg Statement Protecting Minors from Sexual Abuse: Statement Abuse:

A Call to the Catholic Faithful in Canada for Healing, Reconciliation, and Transformation

October 4, 2018 – The Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops (CCCB) released a document entitled, Protecting Minors from Sexual Abuse: A Call to the Catholic Faithful in Canada for Healing, Reconciliation, and Transformation. This document updates and expands the guidelines for the protection of minors and vulnerable adults in Canada. Archbishop Richard Gagnon, along with the Archdiocesan Sexual Abuse Response Committee, will study this new document with a view to updating the procedures of response in the Archdiocese of Winnipeg policies. The Archdiocese currently has a comprehensive Safe Environment Program which is based, in part, on the 1992 CCCB document, From Pain to Hope. THE COMMUNION OF SAINTS is a timely topic as November approaches, the month we celebrate All Saints (Nov. 1) and All Souls (Nov. 2) and pray for the dead. This core belief is stated in the Apostles' Creed: "I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting."

The communion of saints is a "communion," a union, a common bond, a profound connection, a great fellowship – shared among the "saints," the holy ones, the Christian faithful, those who are filled with grace, members of the one body with Christ as the head.

The communion of saints is the Church" (CCC, No. 946). It has three states or divisions, the communion of saints of the living, those who are still on their pilgrim journey on earth; and the communion of saints of the dead or the faithful departed, some of whom are being purified, those in purgatory, and the ones who are enjoying eternal glory in the presence of God, those in heaven (CCC, No. 954).

Spanning the ages: The living are "saints" because they are baptized, members of the Body of Christ, members of the church, unified in faith and belief, praying and receiving the sacraments, and advancing in holiness. Their sainthood is real but unfinished; "they are saints in training" or "saints in progress."

The dead, or the faithful departed, are saints because their time on earth is over. They are the ones who have completed the race, kept the faith, and have been given the crown of righteousness (2 Timothy 4:7,8). When they stood before the Son of Man, they were judged to be righteous and told, "Come, you who are blessed by my Father. Inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world" (Matthew 25:34). They are the sheep for whom the Good Shepherd freely laid down his life (John 10:1-18); the ones who have been escorted by Jesus to the Father's house (John 14:1-3); and the great multitude which no one can count that are gathered around God's throne (Revelation 7:9).

The communion of saints spans the ages. It unites the saints who are living now with all who have gone before, whether they departed yesterday, last year, a generation ago or centuries earlier. The communion also encompasses all places, wherever the saints may be: in different rooms in the same home, next-door neighbors, across the country or to the four corners of the world; and unites those on earth with those beyond, those in purgatory and those who have arrived at their eternal home.

The communion of the living has great concern for those who have died. While separated physically, the living are united to those who have gone before them in spirit through Christ. In their sorrow and grief, they long for the day of reunification in heaven, that where their ancestors have gone, they may also go.

The living express their concern for the faithful departed in prayer, offering prayers for those in purgatory to speed their loved ones on to the fullness of joy, and for those in heaven, offering prayers that they might intercede on their behalf before God. The saints in heaven watch over those who continue their journey on earth by the constant watchfulness and prayers of intercession.

United in worship: While the saints, those whose names are listed in the Book of Life, gather together in solemn assembly at the throne of God in the heavenly liturgy, bow down and worship God day and night, sing hymns of praise, cry out, "Honor, power, and might be to our God forever and ever" (Revelation 7:12) and exclaim, "Amen! Alleluia!" (Revelation 19:4), the saints on earth gather together around God's altar at liturgy week after week, and in praise and worship cry out, "Glory to God in the highest! We worship you. We give you thanks. We praise you for your glory!" And continue, "Holy, holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might!"

The same Christ who reigns on the throne in heaven with his saints above is made present in the Eucharist with his saints below, and when the faithful receive the Eucharist, there is holy Communion between all of God's saints. – Father Van Sloun < thecatholicspirit.com >

STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

Part of the beauty of stewardship spirituality is its simplicity and practicality. It can be summed up in the simple phrase, "All I have is a gift from God and I must make a grateful return to Him for all He has given me."

So simple, that even our youngest parishioners can grasp the concept. Simple, however, does not necessarily mean easy. Simple also does not mean shallow.

Today's readings invite us to look into the depth of a stewardship way of life. And they reveal that it requires the commitment of our whole being to God. It is anything but easy or shallow. It points us to seek after higher things — the wisdom of God and Heaven itself.

Our Second Reading, from the Letter to the Hebrews, shows us a way to obtain such wisdom —it is available to us right in the Scriptures, which are the *living* word of God. Every time we approach them in a spirit of prayer, they will speak to us. God's wisdom is right there for us. All we need to do is commit some daily time to seek it.



Our Gospel Reading from Mark is one of the better-known passages in the Gospel – the story of the rich young man. In response to the man's question on what he must do to obtain eternal life, Jesus tells him to keep the commandments. The man replies that he has always done this much. But he rightfully suspects there is more to being a disciple of Jesus than just following the external rules

We are called to be so much more than rule-followers; we are called to be Christ followers. A stewardship way of life frees us follow Christ with all of our being and so to find eternal life.

STEWARDSHIP RELFECTION

Our readings today are wonderfully consoling and wildly challenging. If we take them to heart, they just might change our lives. For they should call us to profound gratitude for all that God has done for us and inspire us to live lives of thanksgiving and obedience to Him in response to His overwhelming love and mercy.

In the Gospel Reading, from Mark, Jesus tells us in His own words how we can thank Him and how our lives can reflect greatness in His eyes — we can imitate Him. He tells us, "Whoever wishes to be great among you will be your servant; whoever wishes to be first among you will be the slave of all. For the Son of Man did not come to be served but to serve and to give his life as a ransom for many."

Our God has ransomed our lives. In truth, this "ransom" means our lives are not our own but belong to God. We must do what He asks us to do with them. And He has told us clearly what to do — serve others in love as we have been served in love by Him.

This is why service for the Christian Steward is not an add-on to our already busy lives. It is our life.

Over the course of the next week, take these readings to heart. Reflect on the remarkable love God has shown for you. Then look carefully at your daily life. Is it an imitation of the servant-love of your Brother and Savior? What changes do you need to make, perhaps just in attitude, or perhaps to the trajectory of your life as a whole, to live in grateful service to the One who loves you so?

STEWARDSHIP RELFECTION

As Christian stewards we are called to devote a regular portion of our time to God in prayer. Perhaps we find it intimidating to find the right words when approaching our perfect and all-holy God.

Today's Gospel shows us we need to have our "act together" before we can spend time with Him in prayer. In this passage from Mark, we see that Bartimaeus received a powerful answer to prayer at a very low point in his life. There, he sat, begging at the side of the road in a very undignified manner. His posture wasn't exactly reverent, and his prayer wasn't eloquent, just a desperate, "Jesus, son of David, have pity on me."

But it was a sincere cry from his heart. And Jesus, though surrounded by a sizable crowd, heard it, and called for Bartimaeus to come to Him. Folks from the crowd called to Bartimaeus, "Take courage; get up, Jesus is calling you." And right there on the spot, Bartimaeus experienced a profound moment of personal encounter with our Lord and the healing of his vision he desired.

How simple it is to encounter Jesus! All we must do is reach out to Him in prayer and we can be assured that He will hear us and call us to Himself. So let's all take courage this week knowing that Jesus is calling us right now to spend time with Him just as we are, in all our weakness and brokenness. Tell Him, the great High Priest, what your needs are and then, like Bartimaeus, follow Him, and keep on keeping on in this stewardship way of life. It's a life with the ultimate happy ending.
