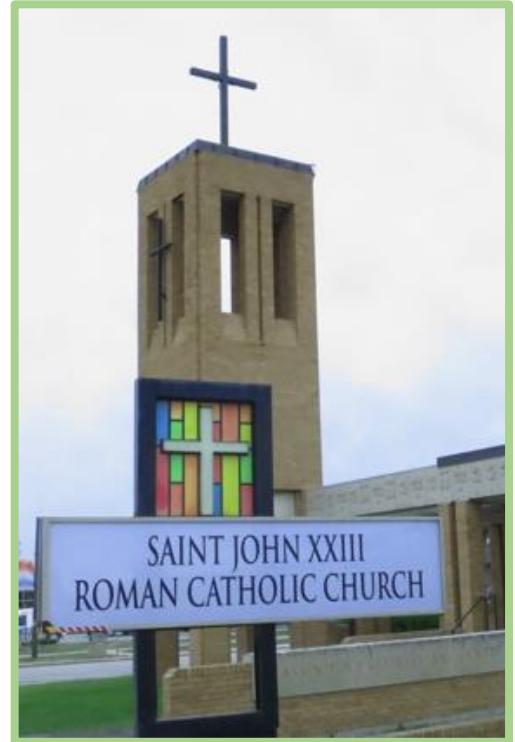

YOUR KIND PRAYERS are requested for the repose of the soul of **Reverend Monsignor Louis J. McCloskey** who passed away June 15, 2023 in Charlottetown, PEI at the age of 86. Msgr. McCloskey was ordained to the priesthood for the Archdiocese of Winnipeg on June 11, 1960 at St. Dunstan's Cathedral Basilica in Charlottetown. Msgr. McCloskey served in many parishes in the Archdiocese of Winnipeg, including as Pastor of John XXIII Parish in Winnipeg (1987-1991). He was appointed a Prelate of Honour by Pope John Paul II on December 1, 1998 and given the title of Monsignor. He retired from active ministry on June 30, 2008. Funeral Mass was celebrated on June 20, 2023 at Ann's Church in Emyvale, PEI. A Memorial Mass for Monsignor McCloskey was celebrated on June 28, 2023 at Notre Dame Church in Selkirk, MB. *May he rest in peace!*

Say what you see

Upon winning the Nobel Peace Prize in 1986, Elie Wiesel was named a "messenger to mankind." The *Los Angeles Times* called him the "most important Jew in America." A Holocaust survivor, Wiesel didn't speak of his experiences for 10 years after his liberation from the camps. Eventually he understood the world needed his witness: "We must take sides. Neutrality helps the oppressor, never the victim. Silence encourages the tormentor, never the tormented.... Wherever men and women are persecuted because of their race, religion, or political views, that place must—at that moment—become the center of the universe." Tell the truth from where you stand.

The unexamined life is not liberating

Interested in ministering, healing, and caring? Intrigued by dream analysis, speaking in tongues, or miracles? Seeking transcendence or the art of meditation? Does your attention reside at the intersection of faith and psychology? If any of the above concern you, there's a Morton Kelsey book with your name on it. Episcopal priest, Jungian therapist, and prolific author, Kelsey notes that we're controlled by what we assume and have never thoughtfully considered: "You can't come to a new point of view until you realize what your brainwashing has been." Take the first step toward inner freedom. Review your assumptions.

Pause before speaking

Words are deeds, as theologian Peter Kreeft astutely reminds us. When we speak our thoughts into the air, we are doing something. So many words circulate in the machinery of our media that we tend to take them for granted and view them as cheap or even meaningless. But words matter. They take root in our minds and hearts, as well as in the thoughts and feelings of people who receive them from us. Before you utter the response, make the call, or hit the send key, pause to contemplate what impact your words may have on someone else.

God's kind of justice

Our exercise of justice can be remarkably heartless. Too often we confuse justice with judgment, imagining justice is only served by lowering the boom on the offending party. The writer of the book of Wisdom describes God's justice as both mighty and clement: that is, powerful and merciful at the same time. Among the loveliest recommendations in the Old Testament is this: "Those who are just must be kind." Written 50 years before the time of Jesus, Wisdom demonstrates why Jesus came to heal, forgive, and rescue—not destroy, condemn, and disown. Make kindness your partner in justice.

String your own pearls

Jewelry is a matter of taste. Some folks like gold; others prefer silver. But in Jewish tradition, the pearl is a metaphor for valuable teaching. Our "pearl of great price," then, is the teaching upon which we build everything else, the motivation that governs our decision-making. What's yours? For some, it's that all life is sacred. For others, the common good must be served. Still others take the preferential option for the poor, or champion stewardship of creation. Remember: You don't have to choose just one.

On June 14, 2023, the CCCB Standing Committee for Family and Life, with its corresponding Office, released a **30-second promotional video** supporting the **Third World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly** to take place on **Sunday, 23 July 2023**.

The CCCB promotional video captures a group of high school students visiting the elderly at a retirement home. The heartwarming interaction of old and young wonderfully represents this year's World Day theme and inspires us to find concrete and creative ways to draw near to the elderly.

Pope Francis inaugurated this World Day to be celebrated each year in July, either on or near the feast of Saints Joachim and Anne, grandparents of Jesus, to help "treasure the spiritual and human wealth that has been handed down from generation to generation."

Living as Catholics in the Public Square Freedom of Religion and Conscience in Canada

A Pastoral Letter by the Episcopal Commission for Justice and Peace.

Thursday, June 22, 2023

The Commission for Justice and Peace of the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops (CCCB) has released a Pastoral Letter titled *Living as Catholics in the Public Square: Freedom of Religion and Conscience in Canada*. This timely document emphasizes the significance of freedom of religion and conscience in our democratic society and explores the role of Catholics in courageously living out their faith in the public square.

The Pastoral Letter observes that freedom of religion and conscience, as enshrined in the Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms, forms the bedrock of our society. It also highlights the crucial role of the State in upholding fundamental freedoms and fostering a common life ordered towards the common good. It calls for a genuine pluralism that recognizes and respects the right to hold specific religious and moral convictions, even when they challenge prevailing norms.

The Pastoral Letter urges Catholics to actively participate in the public square, championing the common good and contributing to public debates. It underscores the importance of religious freedom for all people, as its restriction marginalizes individuals, impedes meaningful public discourse, and diminishes the diverse contributions that different religious believers can offer. The letter encourages Catholics to exercise their religious freedom to evangelize, support Catholic institutions, and engage in various professions and vocations that serve the common good.
