## QUICK GUIDE TO WEDDING MASSES ON FRIDAYS AND SATURDAYS

Ritual Masses (including the *Order of Celebrating Matrimony within Mass*) may not be celebrated on certain days during the liturgical year. This prohibition begins at 4 PM the evening before. Knowing that most weddings are celebrated on Fridays and Saturdays, the following list is intended to show those Fridays and Saturdays on which the readings and prayers for a nuptial Mass <u>may not</u> come from the *Order of Celebrating Matrimony within Mass*. For any other wedding date, please consult the calendar in the Year of Grace for other possible conflicts.

I. Saturdays of Advent (2019) – After 4 PM

November 30

December 7, 14, 21

- II. Vigil of the Epiphany of the Lord (2020) After 4 PM January 4
- III. Saturdays of Lent After 4 PM February 29 March 7, 14, 21, 28 April 4
- IV. The Sacred Paschal Triduum All Celebrations of Matrimony are prohibited April 9, 10, 11
- V. Friday and Saturday within the Octave of Easter All day
   April 17, 18
- VI. Saturdays of Easter After 4 PM April 25 May 2, 9, 16, 23, 30
- VII. Vigil of the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity After 4 PM June 6
- VIII. Vigil of the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ After 4 PM
  June 13
- IX. Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus All day June 19
- X. Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary
   August 14, after 4 PM
   August 15, until 4 PM Ritual Mass may be celebrated after 4 PM (OCM 34, GIRM 372)
- XI. Vigil of the Solemnity of All Saints After 4 PM October 31
- XII. Vigil of the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe After 4 PM November 21
- XIII. Saturdays of Advent (2020) After 4 PM November 28 December 5, 12, 19
- XIV. The Nativity of the Lord (Christmas) (2020) All day December 25
