#### **Feasts and Devotions to Mary**

There are sixteen feasts of the Blessed Virgin throughout the liturgical year. In addition to these feast days, the months of May and October are dedicated to Mary and are the focus of many devotions. Here are five of her major feasts:

#### Immaculate Conception of Mary: December 8, and Mary's Birthday: September 8

Many people mistakenly believe the term *Immaculate Conception* refers to Mary's sinless conception of Jesus, but it actually honors Mary's unique position of being conceived without original sin. It shows that she existed from her conception as prominent in God's redemption plan. God arranged sinlessness as a tribute to her and to prepare for the arrival of the savior through her. The feast of the Immaculate Conception became a holy day of obligation in 1854. Catholics in Spain celebrate this day by decorating houses with flowers and flags and burning candles in the windows the night before the feast.

Mary's birthday falls nine months later. This day honors Mary as God's gift to the people. Traditional feasts, which existed previous to this date and are now associated with the nativity of Mary, include thanksgiving celebrations, the beginning of Indian summer, and fall planting season. Harvest blessings are given in many Catholic Churches.

#### The Annunciation: March 25, and the Visitation: May 31

Near the vernal equinox, the Annunciation marks the celebration of the conception of Jesus in Mary's womb. It occurs nine months before the feast of Christmas, the birth of Christ.

In medieval Europe, pageants and processions marked the celebration of the Annunciation. A child, dressed as an angel and representing Mary, was suspended on a rope in midair. As the angel descended, mothers dropped candy in the pews for children. The children believed that Gabriel had brought these goodies from heaven. In Russia, large wheaten wafers were blessed and distributed after the Mass. The people saved pieces of these wafers to be buried in the fields to assure a good crop, signifying the connection between Mary's fertility and the fertility of the earth.

The feast of the Visitation celebrates Mary's visit to Elizabeth immediately after the Annunciation where the baby in Elizabeth's womb, John the Baptist, stirred in recognition of the messiah in Mary's womb.

### Mary, Mother of God: January 1

"Mary, Mother of God" is a feast first instituted in Jerusalem as early as the middle of the fourth century. It was called the Presentation of the Jesus Christ in the Temple and was celebrated on January 1, which followed the custom in Jewish law of presenting the baby in the temple on the eighth day following birth. The feast focused on the obedience of Mary and Jesus to Mosaic law. At one time, this feast was moved to February 2 and coincided with the pagan feast of lights. This feast day is also called the Solemnity of Mary.
