Thought for the Week

Years ago I was in a prayer group with several other Christian couples meeting every other week for dinner and discussion following. Often the evenings centered on the marginalized: homeless, hungry and disenfranchised. One evening, one of the members of the group was late and eventually showed up with a homeless woman in tow.

Apparently she had been sitting on some church steps; hungry with nowhere to go. When she entered the dining room (we had started dinner). everyone took a deep breath at the unexpected visitor. It's one thing to talk about the homeless but quite another to have them in your home.

She joined us at the dinner table and shared that she had been a middle school English teacher laid off because of budget cuts, lost her home and then forced to live in her car. She was intelligent and thoughtful bringing warmth and meaning to the evening.

I learned that evening that it is so easy to associate negative meaning to a label or a name. "Homeless" can stir up a variety of negative sentiments earned or not but this woman was a delight to be with.

That evening, she was our teacher.

Some Spare Change

As a young Christian, one of my favorite men's retreats was held at Mt. Hermon Conference Center surrounded by mature redwood trees in the Santa Cruz Mountains. One of the more popular speakers leading these retreats was Pastor Ron Richie, who I promise, was Moses reincarnated. Standing well over six feet with long white hair and white beard, you would have thought that you had been time-traveled back to the Old Testament.

At one of those summer conferences he shared a personal practice of saving loose change (coins and dollar bills) until he felt directed by the Holy Spirit to give it to a specific person. One night after a dinner with friends in San Francisco, they were heading back to their cars when they walked past a darkened alley.

Something in Ron's heart stirred and he turned around and walked back into the alley where there was a pile of flattened cardboard boxes. Sensing movement, he lifted one edge of the cardboard and underneath was an elderly woman laying on the cold ground who claimed that she had been praying that if Jesus was real, to show up.

Ron gave her roughly \$200 of saved change converted to twenty dollar bills. After receiving this gift from Ron, she told him, "Tonight, you are my Jesus." Amen?
