Thought for the Week

A few years ago, before the pandemic, my wife and I flew to the John Wayne Airport in Santa Ana, California to attend the Religious Education Conference hosted by the Archdiocese of Los Angeles. It is one of the largest gatherings of its kind where thousands of Catholics gather for a four day event at the Anaheim Convention Center.

The first leg of the trip was a flight from Eugene to Seattle, where I am hoping to get to in this story. Anyway, on landing in Seattle there was a significant cross wind and I am guessing the pilot decided the best approach to the runway was to dive for it and then pull the plane back up at the last moment before the plane's wheels hit the runway. The result was a violent jolt in which a 170,000 pound jet took two solid bounces before returning to earth and the concrete runway.

Deacon's Corner

(Continued from *Thought of the Week*) sighed a collective sigh of relief, the main cabin attendant got on the onboard intercom and offered, "*Well then*;" I suspect in hopes of easing the terrifying landing we had all just experienced.

This weekend's Gospel reading from Luke reminds me a bit of that landing experience. When we are faced with the loss of control of the things we rely on it is unsettling at best.

Apocalyptic scripture or readings that talk about the complete destruction of world as we know it can be terrifying because Jesus wasn't just predicting the destruction of the temple (which was destroyed in AD 70), Jesus is warning us not to put our trust in "bricks and mortar" but in the One who *inhabited* the temple.

I believe Jesus is reminding us this weekend that everything we rely on will someday pass away through, "earthquakes, famines, wars and persecutions." Jesus is warning us that money, status and possessions do not last. It is only God who lasts forever.

Well then, what should be our response? We do not have control of the events that surround us; we can only control our *response* to those events. As Catholics we have a faith in a God who will guide us and care for us through these times. Our faith in this God calls us to trust *this* God with our very lives.

Amen?
