


Archbishop's Catholic Appeal May 18, 2025

Deacon's Corner (cont'd)

Shepherd's Pie, hoping a traditional English meal would be enjoyed by Mr. Churchill. The next dinner guest decided on Pastor Billy Graham, still alive at the time, and meal of meat and potatoes.

After moving around the table with each guest offering their selection of a dinner guest and a main entrée, I was the last. Without really giving it much thought, I simply stated that I would love to share a meal with Jesus with a rack of lamb served as the main entrée. At that point in the dinner conversation, the table went completely silent. Really, I mean, the *irony* of my choice of a dinner guest and entrée wasn't entirely lost on me because I love *both*.

After a few moments (wait for it . . .) the guests burst in rousing laughter. I'm not sure why no one else at the table thought of dining with Jesus but it seemed the most natural thing to me. Thinking about my response to the question later after the guests had left and the dishes were put away, I got to thinking about the reality of *actually* sitting down with Jesus over dinner. I figured after the initial shock of being in the presence of Christ, what *would* I say or *what* question would I ask?

This weekend's Gospel reading from John offers some guidance. Jesus reminds us that His sheep *hear* his voice. The option of hearing his voice suggested to me that I might best *listen* to what Jesus had to say rather than take up time with my inquires. John goes on to say that Jesus *knows* me, so I might want to listen carefully to his advice on how best to *follow* him.

Actually, the more I thought about this whole scenario, dining with Jesus and listening to his thoughts on how to best follow him wasn't that strange. This weekend, depending on which mass you attend, you will hear both his voice spoken in the Liturgy of the Word and we will *all* break bread with our Lord and Savior during communion.

Hallelujah, Amen?


