Deacon's Corner

What Kind of Love is This?

I'm always reluctant to talk about pets but in my experience pets come closest to exemplifying the love that Jesus suggests in this weekend's reading from the Gospel of John when he states, "As I have loved you, so you also should love one another." The pets we choose as companions can very quickly take-up residence in our hearts as beloved and devoted friends.

Last week I was having breakfast with a friend whose pet had become sick enough that the only option was to have their beloved pet put down. An act of compassion that only reflects the love they held for their faithful friend. This is not easy stuff; being forced to choose between an animal suffering or setting them free from whatever disease has infected their bodies. This is not easy stuff because taking the life of something so precious to you while literally becoming part of your family is heart-wrenching.

This breakfast conversation reminded me of our Golden Retriever, Maggie May, who at the age of 10 years developed a . . .



cancerous growth in her throat to such an extent that she was progressively unable to swallow her favorite foods or treats. She suffered in silence as she ate less and less until she seemed to just give up. One morning she solemnly dragged herself into the house from being outside with her head hung low; almost as if to say, "I don't know how much longer I can keep this up; but I don't want to disappoint you by not trying."

That morning my heart broke. What if Maggie was enduring this suffering so as not to deprive us of her friendship; maybe she was continuing to live for us out of a sense of loyalty and love? An instinct so ingrained in her loving nature that she knew no other option but to live for us; overlooking her own pain and suffering. I think this is the kind of love Jesus speaks of in this weekend's gospel reading.

Not long after she had all but given up eating, we had a veterinary doctor come to our home to help Maggie move quietly from this world to the next. She died peacefully in our/her home with both Deborah and me at her side. As I sat with Maggie after the veterinary doctor had left, tears filling my eyes, I asked myself, "What kind of love is this?" What kind of love likely put us before her own pain and suffering? What kind of love carried her to her death with so little consideration or concern for what she might receive in return other than our love?

I honestly don't think the love Maggie (or any other pet) exemplifies for their owners is humanly possible except for the love we experience when we are operating in the realm of the Holy Spirit: such as a mother who cradles her newborn child, parents who watch their toddler take their first few steps or speak their first few words or when we hold an eight-week old puppy in our arms. It is in these moments we experience the nature and kind of love that Christ holds for his children. Amen?
