### **Deacon's Corner**

#### A Sentinel of Time

My best guess is that my maternal grandfather (George Warrell) was born in the late 1800s in Ireland. God called him to ministry in the Methodist Church as a pastor when he was in his late teens. In his early twenties, he was sent on a missionary trip to Portland, Oregon to establish a physical presence of the Methodist faith. Once he arrived in Portland, after weeks of traveling by ship across the Atlantic Ocean and by train across the United States, he began the process of building a small church as well as a small house on an adjacent property for he and his fiancée. Elizabeth, who was waiting in Ireland but planned to duplicate George's trip to the United States, so they could marry, when he had finished the construction of their new home.

When I was nine and my middle brother David was twelve, we traveled by train from Southern California to their home in Portland to spend a week sightseeing as well as the opportunity to spend time with them. When we arrived in Portland, my grandmother had gifted us each with a Kodak . . .


## **SCHOOL**

box camera already loaded with a fresh roll of color film to record our visit.

Anyway, the home my grandfather had built was a modest two bedroom house with the attic setup as a guest bedroom. On the main level there was a small living room with a fireplace, a dining room, a small kitchen, and my grandfather's study. On a shelf over the living room fireplace was a mantle clock that chimed on the hour and on the half-hour of every day. The chimes of the clock gave the day a predictable rhythm I found predicably and pleasing. One morning, I watched as my grandfather wound the clock, and without my asking, he explained that he had been faithfully winding this clock every 4-5 days since moving into their home years earlier.

Fast forward twenty years and when both my grandparents had passed from this realm leaving the mantle clock with my parents which they kept stored in their garage. One afternoon, during a visit, I was rummaging through their garage to collect all my high school and college memorabilia when I found the mantle clock stored in a cardboard box. I asked my mom if I could take it, since it wasn't being used in their home. For years now the clock has been in my care and I have been winding this clock every 4-5 days, just like my grandfather had done before me for much of *his* life.

This weekend's responsorial psalm says, "So teach us to number our days that we may get a heart of wisdom." got me thinking about this mantle clock that is now well over a 100 years old and has been faithfully *numbering* the minutes of every day as a watchman of time, reminding me, as it did my grandparents, of the transitory and precious nature of life with its enviable struggles, victories, joys, pain, and ultimately the private death we all must face. The clock and its unwavering measure of time is a reminder to all of us that wisdom is gained at the price of failure and loss; the enviable failure of human enterprise and loss of those we love. The Good News is that Christ waits for us beyond this finite world in which time is no longer measured. Amen?
