A Trustworthy Steward

Scott Neeson was born in Edinburgh, Scotland and at age five moved with his family to Elizabeth, South Australia. When Scott turned sixteen, he dropped out of high school and took a job with a local drive-in theater. Being a good steward of every task he was given, he rose through the ranks being trusted with the responsibility of larger and more complex assignments. Because of his trustworthiness. Scott was elevated to Vice President and then ultimately President of 20th Century Fox International and Head of Marketing at Sony Pictures.

Scott was achieving the American dream; he lived in a multimillion home Southern California, owned exotic sport's cars, traveled in private jets, and mingled in Hollywood's celebrity circles. One of his responsibilities at 20th Century Fox was to arrange and cater to popular movie stars as they traveled to and from movie sets requiring Scott to stock one of the company's private jets with an actor's favorite foods, wines, and liquors.



with the choicest cuts of beef, fresh lobsters flown in from Maine, the finest wines from Napa Valley, and the most expensive liquors to satisfy the movie star's every whim.

On the morning of the flight, the actress arrived, surrounded by her entourage of attendants and associates. Once settled into her seat, she asked one of her attendants to fix her a cocktail made with her favorite brand of alcohol. The attendant, not finding that specific alcohol, offered to make the drink with a similar product. Furious the jet hadn't been stocked with *her* favorite brand, she stormed off the plane leaving Scott with thousands of dollars worth of food to spoil; wine and alcohol to give away.

Feeling the need for a break, Scott took the advice of a friend who suggested he spend his vacation in Cambodia. During the trip, he happened upon hundreds of small children scavenging for food and recyclables in a garbage dump in Phnom Penh; often with their fathers using the proceeds from the sale of the recyclables to buy alcohol for themselves. That day in Phnom Penh's garbage dump changed Scott's life.

In 2003, Scott returned to his home in Hollywood, resigned his position with 20th Century Fox, and began the process of liquidating all of his property. In 2004, Scott returned to Phnom Penh and started Cambodian Children's Fund, initially housing 45 children financed with the funds from the sale of his previous lavish lifestyle. Since its inception, CCF, through the generous donations and support of those captured by Scott's story, has provided for the care, education, and welfare of thousands of children offering safe housing, nutritious food, medical care, and the opportunity for the children to pursue their educational goals.

In this weekend's reading from Gospel of Luke, we are reminded that, "The person who is trustworthy in very small matters, is also trustworthy in great ones." I can't imagine a better example of stewardship than the story of Scott Neeson, CCF, and the saving of the garbage dump children of Phnom Penh.
