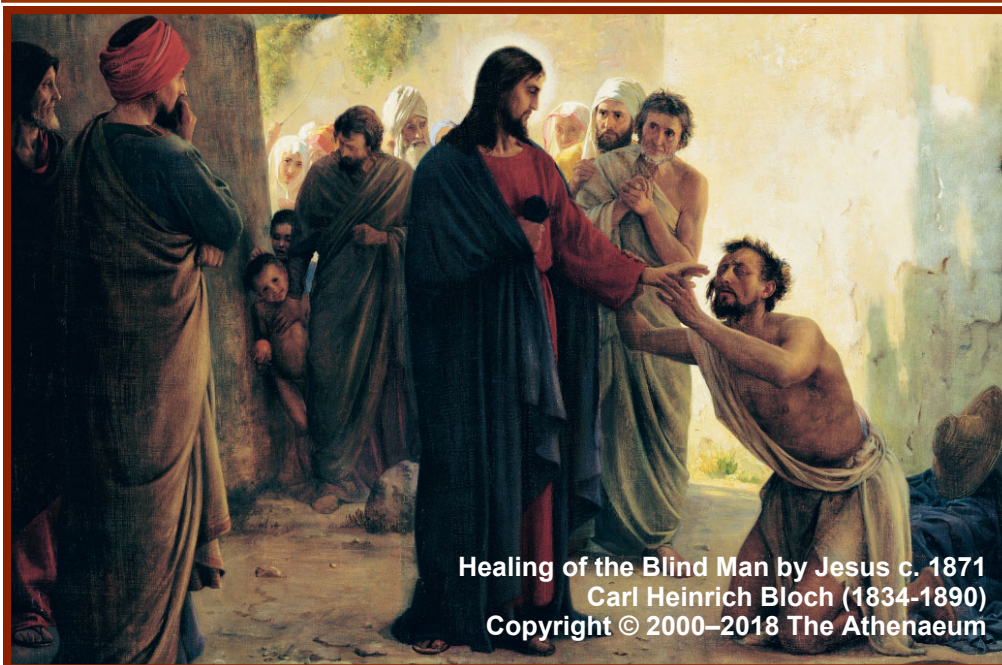

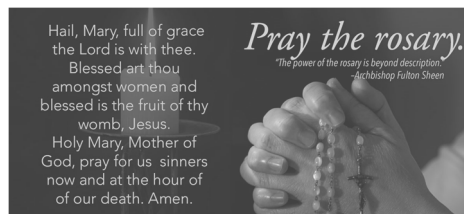

The Pastor's Keyboard—Msgr. Richard Huneger

Today is the **Solemnity of St Joseph**, the patron saint of our parish. There is another feast of **St Joseph the Worker** on May 1, introduced by Pope Pius XII as a Christian counterpoint to the annual Communist May 1 Workers Day, because the materialist concept of life underlying the Communist political system was one of working for "bread that perishes," but the spiritual concept of life underlying the Christian vision is one of working for "bread that abides unto life eternal, ... the real manna, from heaven ... that give life to the world" (cfr Jn 6:27, 31-33). As we know, the Communist "manna" gave the world the treacherous, murderous plans and policies that destroyed well over 100 million in the 20th century alone, in Russia and China.

But today, our attention is turned to Joseph, the foster father of Jesus, and provider and protector of the **Holy Family** in Nazareth. If we look at the dynamics of that family, with X-Ray vision, we see through it (as the ear hears through sounds to their meanings), a larger family, the Universal Church worldwide, of which Joseph is revered as the Patron. The word "**patron**" comes from the Greek word "patēr" (Latin, "pater"; Italian-Spanish, "padre"; German-English, "Vater, father"). In ancient Rome someone who had money (but not talent, for instance) would make a deal with someone who had talent (but not money): the patron-client relationship. Each would get out of the deal what he didn't have. It took the two to tango. The term "**patronizing**" has taken on a negative connotation: the patron is the "active" part of the relationship, and the client merely "passive." The image conveyed is that of the powerful, the wealthy, the manipulator, versus the powerless, impoverished, pawn. At its worst it becomes an image underlying justification for growth of Big Government as "patron" (aka "The Nanny State") and the Citizenry as "client" (aka "The Entitlement Populace"). The ancient idea of the "**Citizen**" gets lost: the "citizen" was a property owner, who through his property, at his disposal, and subject to his values and choices, provided a buffer (the more citizens the better) between the Haves and the Have-Nots, to check the devolution of the social system into Tyranny, where those who have little or nothing give up, become passive, look to the "Strong Man" to be their "Demagogue" ("People-Leader"), to give them handouts ("bread and circuses") by robbing everyone else that "has" something. America, however, and its concept of widespread citizenship, and ownership, and acting in self-interest, was based on the idea of thereby providing liberty through checking the devolution into Tyranny, and keeping our system away from Big Government, by emphasizing liberty with responsibility.

Thus, **Alexis de Tocqueville**, in his famous work *Democracy in America* (1830's) famously stated that in the USA, "No one owes anyone else anything." That is, no one is allowed a "Title" (like Duke or Baron), and no one is "Entitled" by mere circumstance of birth to have a silver spoon in his mouth. Each person is expected to fulfill his desires and hopes by rolling up his sleeves and getting to work. That is, each person is a "Moral Agent," with responsibility for his life, and both for the good fortune of his wise choices and the misfortune of his foolish ones. "You make your bed. You lie in it." No concept of entitlement to have your bad choices reversed on the backs of others: You commit gluttony (the government, i.e., others, is not responsible to provide you a feather to tickle your throat so that you can vomit); you bring about a pregnancy (the government, i.e., others, is not responsible to pay for an abortion). Actually, the American concept of responsibility is deeply Christian: "He will judge each according to his deeds" as if "by fire" to see of what each is made; however, St Paul ends on an encouraging note: each will then receive his "praise from God" (1Cor 3:13-15, 4:5). The "fire" purges away the faulty and ephemeral, to reveal any hidden good that was present. Something to think about when we judge ourselves or others. Looking at the bad is not the final word; seeking to uncover the good is, i.e., to identify the Pearl of Great Price, where God's rule and grace are at work "incognito" in our lives.

As **Patron of the Universal Church**, provident and protective, as in the Holy Family, St Joseph has something to give us. Stained glass windows and paintings of the Home at Nazareth, always depict him teaching Jesus how to "make" things; teaching the one "through whom all things were made" to be an artisan, a carpenter, a builder! He was fostering in Jesus' **humanity**, the development of a growing conformity to, or realization of, the **divine** creative role of the Word of God in the Universe. Jesus was growing up as a hidden model of how we ought to mature, as creative, constructive, builders (rather than destroyers) of our life together, every one of us being a significant moral agent with something to contribute that we "freely" give to the world (this is the opposite of the lone Tyrant who "forces" everything to happen). In a famous picture the Child Jesus plays with nails and a cross-shaped piece of wood on the floor of Joseph's workshop.
