



#### Pastor's Letter

Dear Parish Family,

Summer is here and our children have started their vacation and a needed break. I wish them well and pray that they have fun and enjoy the summer. This weekend, I am in North Carolina to celebrate a my niece's wedding and share the joy of family and friends.

As previously mentioned, the compressor for the Church's air conditioner needs to be repaired. Since my announcement, a parishioner came to see me offering to anonymously pay for the expenses for the compressor. I was overwhelmed by the generous support by this parishioner. Such overwhelming generosity and support makes St. Andrew's the wonderful parish it is. I thank him, in the name of the parish, for his kindness and stewardship.

Permission has been given by the Archdiocese for us to replace the existing church roofing system. The Archdiocese's investigation, found that the roofing system in our church has begun to fail at the joints, resulting in moisture infiltration, and it has been determined that the existing roofing system is in poor condition and will need to be replaced. It was, therefore, recommended by the Archdiocese that we do the necessary repairs in order to stabilize and maintain the structural integrity of the church. Our Finance Council and Pastoral Council are doing a review on this big project. A few months ago, the Finance Council also approved a pump replacement for our cooling tower. There were several issues with pipes leaking, bearings, pump seals, etc. Upon review, Reiner, the company overseeing this project, determined that the cooling tower pump requires replacement. Approval was given by the Finance Council to proceed with this project at a cost is more than \$7000.00.

Another priority is to update our sound system. For several months, we have been doing some experiments with the test speakers. But after several months of testing, we still need to do more to improve the quality of our sound system. I have contacted the Monti Brothers, a company who are well-known nationwide for their expertise on sound systems. They gave me a detailed proposal for a new sound system at an approximate cost of \$39,000.00. I am bringing this up for discussion and approval to the Parish and Finance Councils. Personally, I would like to pursue this project as soon as possible. Part of the money from our Capital Campaign will go for this project. But, if anyone would like to donate to cover some of the cost, we would be very grateful.

The retaining wall that needs to be repaired is put on hold for now, until we get some money from our Capital Campaign. This is also another big project that we need to do when we get the necessary funding.

Our Sunday collections have been dwindling quite significantly. I am alarmed that we are not able to pursue other means of revenue. I really don't know how we can continue to do the needed repairs in our facilities, provide the programs and pay the salaries of our employees. Therefore, I ask every family member in our parish to please support our church. If you are able to increase your contribution a little bit, it would be appreciated. I also pray that those who have been unable to provide financial support of any kind, that you consider making a contribution to help do God's work.

May you all have a wonderful summer. God bless you all. Sincerely in Christ.


## FEAST OF SAINTS PETER AND PAUL JUNE 29
