Confession will be offered on Saturday at 4:00 pm in north vestibule or outdoors.

Live streaming of our daily Masses will continue. As for Sunday Mass, we will live stream the Saturday vigil at 5:00 pm and the Spanish Mass on Sunday at 7:00 pm. All will be viewable on our [Facebook page](#) and later through our [website](#) so those unable to attend may connect spiritually with our faith community. The English Mass can also be seen on WCTV on Sunday at 10:00 am and 2:00 pm on Optimum Channel 77 and Verizon Fios Channel 24.

Through Jesus Christ





First Reading: Jeremiah 20:10-13

Because the prophet Jeremiah foretold disaster for Jerusalem, he was denounced. But Jeremiah trusted in the Lord and overcame his persecutors.

Second Reading: Romans 5:12-15

Paul explains to the Romans that Adam's sin brought death to all, but Christ's gift of himself brought grace and life.

Gospel: Matthew 10:26-33

In authoritative and encouraging words, Jesus urges the apostles to fear nothing -- only him who can destroy the soul. Telling them "every hair of your head has been counted," he promises that "Whoever acknowledges me before men I will acknowledge before my Father in heaven."




