Note from Pastor:

It's hard to believe June is almost over. I hope your summer has started well. If you have an opportunity for rest and relaxation this summer, I hope you get to take advantage of it! In our church's liturgical year, summer is usually marked by the long "green season" of ordinary time. But before we move back into that season, we have one last special feast day to celebrate this weekend—Corpus Christi- the feast of the Body and Blood of Christ.

In some places this feast is marked by processions and special prayers. But for each of us, it hopefully renews an interior attachment to making our holy communions fruitful, faithful, frequent, and fervent.

The Church gives us some guidelines for ways to receive the gift of holy communion well.

Be in a state of grace. If we are conscious of serious sin, make a good confession so as to bring our actual life in union with what we say by receiving communion—that God is first for us.

Fast. At least one hour, as a way to prepare us to focus on the spiritual food we are about to receive.

Recognize His presence. Genuflect to the tabernacle upon entering and leaving church so as to reinforce our awareness of His true presence.

Receive correctly. Either directly on the tongue or on the palm, know that it is truly Jesus. Be careful not to let particles fall, because it isn't bread, it is our Lord truly present. A bow or a genuflection before we receive is also a way to let our body language strengthen our understanding and appreciation.

Pray. Upon returning to our pew spend some time in quiet *communion*... intimate union, with the God you have just received. Speak to Him in love, from the heart in these precious moments.

What a gift we have in our Eucharistic Lord. A gift to truly cherish!

Hospitalization—Sacrament of the Sick Suggestions

1. If you are going to be hospitalized (non-emergency), consider asking a parish priest to celebrate the Sacrament of the Sick before entering the hospital.
2. If entering a Catholic Hospital, please register as a Catholic and ask to be placed on the Anointing/Holy Communion list.
3. If entering a commercial or denominational hospital, please register as a Catholic and ask the Pastoral Care Office to notify the Catholic chaplain.

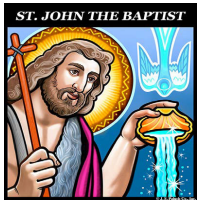
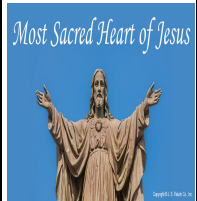
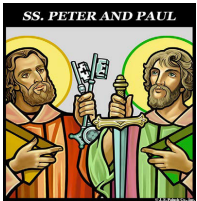
