FROM FR. KUNKEL

In appreciation of his twenty-five years of loyal service, a corporation gave one of their faithful employees an all-expense-paid trip to Europe. When he returned, they asked him about the trip. He replied, "The only thing I can say is that I wish I had gone to Paris before I was "born again."

There is a lot of that in all of us – the notion that if you let the power of God take over in your life, you give up the fun of Paris. We need to realize that there is no fun and no pleasure in anything in our lives that opposes God's will! We need to understand that the only things that will give any lasting pleasure are those things that are rooted in the Being of God, and in his purpose for our lives!

Similarly, after pursuing a course of religious instruction in a certain parish, a woman who worked as a housekeeper in

a busy hotel, told the pastor that she would like to be baptized and become a parishioner. The pastor asked her to give some of the details of her conversion. "I had something come into my life that I had never experienced before," she said. "Can you be more specific?" the pastor asked. "Well," she said, "I can't talk theology to you, and I still don't know my Bible very well. However, I can tell you that ever since I got religion I don't sweep the dirt under the rug anymore."

John the Baptist appeared in the wilderness proclaiming a baptism of repentance. Repentance means to turn away from that which is wrong and sinful and estranges us from God. There is only one way to turn – TO THE FUTURE! The past is gone. We cannot replay it again. We cannot go back and sweep our transgressions "under the rug," so to speak. Again, there is only one way to turn in the spirit of genuine repentance - the future. Unfortunately, it is the most difficult way to turn because we really don't know what is out there! Therefore, we can only live by faith – trusting that God is already there, eagerly waiting to welcome us home.



Merry Christmas from St. Mary's Respect Life Ministry! As we celebrate the birth of our Lord and Savior, please remember to pray for the pre-born baby you spiritually adopted in November. Your spiritually adopted child is now two months old in gestation and needs you to pray that his/her mother awaits the birth of her child with trust in God, just as Mary awaited the birth of her Son.

Pray for your Little One by name. If you haven't named your Spiritually Adopted baby, ask God to help you.

Second Month (size: about 2 inches)

The developing baby is now called a 'fetus' which is Latin for 'Little One'. She is making rapid progress developing all her external and internal organs. During the second month baby teeth form; fingers and toes are developing. Ears, nose, lips and tongue can now be clearly seen. Brain waves can be recorded. The skeleton changes from cartilage to bone. Forty muscle sets begin their first exercises. This Little One can now suck her thumb. By 8 weeks all body systems are present.
