### <u>CEMETERY INFORMATION FOR THE MOWING</u> <u>SEASON</u>

During mowing season, April to November, placing potted or fresh flowers on the ground of the grave is not permitted, except for Easter, Mother's Day and Father's Day and must be removed within 15 days from the holiday. Plastic flower vases must be on the stone itself, not on the ground. Toys, balloons, lights, strings are prohibited unless attached to the grave marker. Planting of flowers around the grave marker is not permitted.

\*Clement Glenn was the only Confederate Soldier from Harford Co. to be killed during the War at the battle of Bunker Hill W.V. September 1864.
