Second Month (size: about 2 inches)

The developing baby is now called a 'fetus' which is Latin for 'Little One'. She is making rapid progress developing all her external and internal organs. During the second month baby teeth form; fingers and toes are developing. Ears, nose, lips and tongue can now be clearly seen. Brain waves can be recorded. The skeleton changes from cartilage to bone. Forty muscle sets begin their first exercises. This Little One can now suck her thumb. By 8 weeks all body systems are present.

The March for Life in DC takes place on Friday, January 19. This year's theme is "Unique from Day One: Pro-Life is Pro-Science."

When we are Bethlehem-bound we experience our own Advent in His.

When we are Bethlehem-bound we can no longer look the other way conveniently not seeing stars not hearing voices.

We can no longer excuse ourselves by busily tending our sheep or our kingdoms...

This Advent, let's go to Bethlehem and see this thing that the Lord has made known to us... lets ponder in our hearts this Gift of Gifts...Through the tinsel let's look for the gold of the Christmas Star. In the excitement and confusion, in the merry chaos, let's listen for the brush of the angel's wings.

Let's go to Bethlehem and find our kneeling places.
