

### Catechism of the Catholic Church

## 293. When is it possible to give Holy Communion to other Christians?

Catholic ministers may give Holy Communion licitly to members of the Oriental Churches which are not in full communion with the Catholic Church whenever they ask for it of their own will and possess the required dispositions. Catholic ministers may licitly give Holy Communion to members of other ecclesial communities only if, in grave necessity, they ask for it of their own will, possess the required dispositions, and give evidence of holding the Catholic faith regarding the sacrament.

### 294. Why is the Eucharist a "pledge of future glory"?

The Eucharist is a pledge of future glory because it fills us with every grace and heavenly blessing. It fortifies us for our pilgrimage in this life and makes us long for eternal life. It unites us already to Christ seated at the right hand of the Father, to the Church in heaven and to the Blessed Virgin and all the saints.

In the Eucharist, we "break the one bread that provides the medicine of immortality, the antidote for death and the food that makes us live forever in Jesus Christ." (Saint Ignatius of Antioch)



### Staying Holy: A Summer Game Plan by FAITH NOAH (Life Teen Blog)

### 1. Make a Schedule

So, first thing's first. Set a schedule. Schedule out the basic plan of each weekday: wakeup time, work, meals, and...prayer! Treat this prayer time like classes on your school schedule. It is—in every sense of the word—sacred time. Plan your commitments around this prayer block whenever possible. And most importantly, stick to it! New habits take time, but remember, time in prayer is never wasted.

#### 2. Pick a Goal

In what ways would you like your prayer to grow this summer? Pick a goal that is unique to you and reasonable. Here are a few ideas:

The Rosary: if you only have 15-20 minute time blocks for prayer, or you want to pray while on the go, you should make the rosary your prayer goal. The Blessed Mother's intercession will work wonders in your spiritual life through the beautiful repetition of this form of prayer.

Divine Mercy Chaplet: If you've got a short attention span and want to start with smaller chunks of time, or if you feel attracted to Jesus' mercy, then DMC is for you. Short but mighty, it's a great daily reminder of Christ's love for us.

**Adoration**: If you want to grow in love for the Eucharist, or don't quite understand the concept of Christ's Body, prayer time in front of the Blessed Sacrament is the way to go. Sometimes it can be challenging to sit in silence, but the Lord often provokes great contemplation as we sit face to face with His real presence. Feel free to bring a journal, book, or any other form of prayer to incorporate in with this time in Adoration.

**Daily Mass**: Mass is the source and summit of our faith, so why wouldn't we want to go every day!? Committing to Mass during the weekdays can be a beautiful challenge and blessing. It's a great way to come together with the Church, receive Christ's peace, and center yourself during a hectic day. If you've got the time to make it work, it can only help!

If one of these jumps out for you, go for it! Even better if you're unfamiliar with it. The best way to learn a new type of prayer is to jump right in and try it. You'd be surprised at the spiritual depths it could call you to!

## Father Marty's Corner

Our gospel today was just heard on the solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus on Friday, 23 June.

It also is a choice for funeral liturgies and for the celebration of the Anointing of the Sick. This particular passage is very special to me. My first assignment as a priest was Sacred Heart of Jesus Parish in Allentown. Suspended from the wall was a life-size image of the Sacred Heart of Jesus with arms extended (similar to our statue at the entrance to our parking lot) inviting all people to come to Him. This gospel passage speaks to that invitation. Jesus takes us as we are. We may feel that we are too sinful to approach Him. He does not demand that we have our



lives in perfect shape before we enter into a relationship with Him. He desires union with us. At times we are indeed, heavily burdened but He promises to refresh us. At the core of this message is Jesus invites us into union with Him as we are. He walks with us and carries our burdens so that we are not alone. He promises rest and peace in Him for those who follow His lead. What a great consolation to the heart in distress!

Sacred Heart of Jesus we implore, may we love you more and more!

### Did you know?

That Pope Francis is the 266th and current Pope of the Roman Catholic Church, a title he holds *ex officio* as Bishop of Rome,

and sovereign of Vatican City. He chose Francis as his papal name in honor of Saint Francis of Assisi. Francis is the first Jesuit pope, the first from the Americas, the first from the Southern Hemisphere and the first Pope from outside Europe since the Syrian Gregory III, who reigned in the 8th century.

#### WE HAVE A BISHOP!

The Vatican announced today that Pope Francis has appointed a priest of the Diocese of Allentown, Reverend Monsignor Alfred A. Schlert, as the Fifth Bishop of Allentown. Bishop-elect Schlert is the first priest of the Diocese to be appointed to serve as its Bishop. He has been serving as the Diocesan Administrator since his election by the Diocesan College of Consultors on February 1, 2017 following the January 31 installation of his predecessor Most Reverend John Barres as the Bishop of Rockville Centre, NY. Bishop-elect Schlert was born to Alfred and Marylou (DeRose) Schlert in Easton on July 24, 1961, just six months after the Diocese of Allentown was formed. He was educated at St. Jane Frances de Chantal Elementary School and Notre Dame High School, both in Easton. He prepared for the Priesthood at St. Charles Borromeo Seminary near Philadelphia and the Pontifical Roman Seminary and St. John Lateran University in Rome. Most Reverend Thomas J. Welsh ordained him a priest at the Cathedral of Saint Catherine of Siena in Allentown on September 19, 1987.
