Catechism of the Catholic Church

354. What is the relationship between the sacraments and the death of a Christian?

The Christian who dies in Christ reaches at the end of his earthly existence the fulfillment of that new life which was begun in Baptism, strengthened in Confirmation, and nourished in the Eucharist, the foretaste of the heavenly banquet. The meaning of the death of a Christian becomes clear in the light of the death and Resurrection of Christ our only hope. The Christian who dies in Christ Jesus goes "away from the body to be a home with the Lord" (2 *Corinthians* 5:8).

355. What do funeral rites express?

Although celebrated in different rites in keeping with the situations and traditions of various regions, funerals express the paschal character of Christian death in hope of the resurrection. I walked up the hill to this tiny little chapel, opened the doors.

and stepped inside. It was dark, chilly, and extremely quiet. I slid into a pew, knelt, and began to pray. I thought I could hear myself thinking. I looked down at my watch...3 minutes had passed. 3 minutes? I could hardly believe it. I looked next to me at the only other person who was in the chapel—a monk, who was sitting, barefooted, eyes closed, and smiling.

He made it look so easy, so peaceful. I, on the other hand, was in agony. I had promised myself I would stay in adoration for an hour—since that's about how long Mass was. I closed my eyes, tried to relax. "Pray, Caitlin," I coached myself, "it's not that hard." I opened my eyes. Another 5 minutes had gone by. 52 minutes to go, but who was counting?

Then it dawned on me that my whole attitude was wrong. God wasn't forcing me to be there, to spend an hour with Him because I had missed Mass. I was choosing to be there. Did I want to be there? Did I want to spend time with Jesus? I did. So I asked God for the grace to let me sit there with Him, in silence, peacefully.

Father Marty's Corner

PRAY! ACT! RESPOND! These are the three actions that Jesus clearly accomplished in the gospel today.

After Jesus had fed the people, He got into a boat crossed to the other side. Then, He proceeded to go up to the mountain to pray alone. I believe He was probably physically and emotionally spent on tending to the needs of the people so He desired time alone in union with His Father in heaven. Jesus leaves His place of prayer during the night to be with His disciples who are in need of His calming spirit. He acts by making His way to their side. The only challenge is that He does this by walking on the water.



This would be problematic even for those who are always

calm, cool and collected. Imagine the emotions of the disciples seeing this sight! Jesus responds by trying to calm their fears. Peter, being Peter, wants to come to Jesus on the water. This works until Peter focuses more on himself than on Jesus and then he begins to sink. Jesus responds by saving him. Then Jesus asks, "Why did you doubt?"

This is a reminder to all of us that we are called to trust in Jesus and His message. It requires that we focus on Him and not on ourselves. We will be much more successful on the journey if our eyes are on the prize. Let our faith journey be marked with **prayer**, action and response!

Did you know?

"The Falling Asleep of the Holy Mother of God" is the earliest extant written document describing the end of Mary's life, and as we can see, it clearly indicates that Mary died before her body was assumed into Heaven. The Feast of the Assumption was first celebrated in the sixth century in the Christian East, where it was known as the Dormition of the Most Holy Theotokos (the Mother of God)...celebrated on August 15th.

Question: Are Mary's apparitions and messages to the children at Fatima, Bernadette at Lourdes, and to others considered by the Church "divine" revelations that we must believe in?

Last week's Answer: What Pope of the 20th Century had one of the shortest reigns in Church History? Who did he succeed as Pontiff? Pope John Paul I served as pontiff for 33 days, from August 26, 1978 to August 28, 1978. He was the last in a successive line of Italian popes dating back to Clement VII in 1523. He was known as the "Smiling Pope.
