#### A Letter from our Pastor

Dear Friends,

Today the Church celebrates the feast of the Baptism of the Lord. We hear in today's gospel how the whole story began. Luke says: After all the people had been baptized [by John] and Jesus also had been baptized and was praying, heaven was opened and the Holy Spirit descended upon him in bodily form like a dove. So, for us, Jesus showed the way by being baptized. We are also reminded that the Holy Spirit is given to us in Baptism as the Spirit was given to Jesus as well. The scene had to be quite exciting for all those who had the privilege of seeing this happening right before their eyes. Curiously, the Rite of Baptism near the beginning of the ceremony says: My children, the Christian community welcomes you with great joy. The scene for us today is still very exciting because we are able to see God at work in the community through this initial Sacrament of Initiation. Let us not take for granted our life of faith and how it began in the simple gesture of pouring water and the Trinitarian formula. Our lives are changed forever. We are grateful for Jesus leading the way.

#### MEMORANDUM

4 January 2019 The Memorial of Saint Elizabeth Ann Seton

RE: Suspension of the Sign of Peace/Reception of the Chalice

In light of the heightened cases of influenza being reported in our five-county area and the 2 January 2019 change in the Pennsylvania Department of Health's Influenza Status from "sporadic" to "widespread," His Excellency, Most Reverend Alfred A. Schlert, directs that the Exchange of the Sign of Peace and the Reception of Holy Communion from the Chalice be suspended beginning with the Vigil and Sunday Masses on the weekend of 12-13 January 2019. This suspension will be in effect until the incidence of influenza subsides in our region.

As a pastoral provision, His Excellency allows the option for the Exchange of the Sign of Peace to be exercised for funeral Masses or wedding Masses, if the pastor/administrator deems it appropriate. The Reception of Holy Communion from the Chalice is only permitted for priests and deacons during this temporary suspension.

In those parishes where the Reception of Holy Communion is commonly given under both Forms, please use this as a catechetical moment to reinforce the Church's constant teaching that the entire Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Christ is present in the Sacred Host and that the reception of either species is sufficient to receive the graces of the Holy Eucharist, provided one is in the state of grace.

Thank you for your kind attention to this matter and for your dedicated priestly ministry to the people entrusted to your care.




