



Religious Education has begun! We are so happy to see your children. This week, they received information on the Circle of Grace program. The Diocese of Allentown has once again requested that we give safe environment training for our students. It is called Circle of Grace. The philosophy of the program teaches that we recognize God's love by helping them understand that each of us lives and moves in a Circle of Grace. As adults, we hold the responsibility to help young people understand and respect their own dignity and that of others. A truly safe and protective environment is one where young people recognize when they are safe or unsafe and know how to bring their concerns to the trusted adults in their lives. Our Catechists will present this information to the children in October/November. Please read over the information and if you discern that you would not like your child to attend that particular session, fill out the form attached to the description and send it in to PREP with your child on September 27th.

For Level 8 students receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation, we will have practice in the Church on Sunday, October 1st at 2pm. Sponsors should attend but if they are not available, parents should attend. Confirmation is scheduled for 4:30pm on Tuesday, October 3rd.

Church Memorials 2023

Sanctuary candle: A sanctuary candle burns in our church to remind us of the sacramental presence of Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist. If you wish to have the sanctuary candle in the church burn for a full week in memory of a loved one, please contact the parish office. Suggested offering: \$10.

Bread and Wine: In the early Church it was customary for the People of God to provide the bread and wine to be used at the Celebration of the Eucharist. If you wish to participate in the ancient tradition of providing the bread and wine for the Celebration of the Eucharist in the church as a memorial for your Family or your deceased loved ones. The suggested offering: \$25.

Altar Flowers: It is an ancient custom to decorate the altar with flowers as a symbol of our praise to God and thanks for all blessings we've been given. Altar flowers may be donated in honor of/memory of your loved ones living and deceased. Suggested offering: \$60

IONA Memorial Fund: Enrollment of loved ones in the Iona Memorial Fund is a perpetual remembrance with Mass celebrated once a month for "Those Enrolled in the Iona Memorial Fund". Enrollment is a \$25 offering. The intention for these funds is to pay for Liturgical supplies: vestments, altar cloths and the like.
