

Today's Readings

Reading I: Isaiah 5: 1-7

This "song" of the Lord's vineyard is really a parable about His unrequited love for Israel and her sinful response. It also tells of a future judgment.

Reading II: Philippians 4: 6-9

Here is Paul's call to joy and peace of mind. He also makes notice that God's peace "surpasses all understanding."

The Gospel: Matthew 21: 33-43

The parable Jesus tells is really an allegory of salvation history. Israel (the vineyard) became the victim of its own leaders, who rejected the landowner's (God's) only Son.







Church Memorials 2023

Sanctuary candle: A sanctuary candle burns in our church to remind us of the sacramental presence of Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist. If you wish to have the sanctuary candle in the church burn for a full week in memory of a loved one, please contact the parish office. Suggested offering: \$10.

Bread and Wine: In the early Church it was customary for the People of God to provide the bread and wine to be used at the Celebration of the Eucharist. If you wish to participate in the ancient tradition of providing the bread and wine for the Celebration of the Eucharist in the church as a memorial for your Family or your deceased loved ones. The suggested offering: \$25.
